to support of Allied armies in France.

Plans called the channel skies throughout the morning. One bomber fleet took more than an hour to cross the coast.

Attack Paul Dumps

Twice within three hours last night, R. A. F. Lancasters and Halifaxes attacked three full dumps in northern France, all considerable distances from the battle front and each containing hundreds of tons of oil.

All three dumps—St. Albans-La Lys in the Pas-de-Calais area, in the Foret de Luchaux to the south and in the Foret de Chantilly just north of Paris—were left in flames.

More than 3,000 sorties were flown yesterday against German front positions in support of troops driving toward Paris, but Allied appraisal of the results was mixed again by report that some explosives fell short, bombing was unfavorable over the battle area today, but prospects were for improvement.

Claim Losses Heavy

Of the stale into Germany and Hungary today, German broadcasts said heavy U. S. bombers with strong fighter escort struck into the southern Reich from the west and suffered losses in air battles over Budapest and Lake Balaton.

R.A.F. Mosquitoes Again Ranged

Over France from the battle zone to 200 miles beyond last night in search of transport targets, but the crews noted a marked lack of activity on previously busy roads and railways.

Mosquitoes bombed and strafed some trains, however, and started fires among a number of oil tanks north of Fountainsbleu. Others dumped two-ton blockbusters on Cologne for the second time in three nights.

Bombing Flying Bomb Attacks

London, Aug. 8.—(P)—The Germans resumed their flying bomb attacks upon Britain today after a night of sporadic assaults which an official announcement said had caused damage and casualties in residential areas in London and the southern counties.

Quebec Votes Protest King War Policies

won only 37 seats, compared to the comfortable majority of 59 it held in the outgoing Legislature. The Liberals were leading in one undecided constituency and the third voting is to be on Aug. 24.

If the Union Nationale, which had only 17 seats in the last Legislature—wins 66 seats, Godbout would resign and Duplessis, who was premier from 1936 to 1939, would take over. If the Union Nationale fails to garner 40, Godbout might remain in office despite his minority, but dissolution of all the Legislature and another election would be likely to follow soon.

The defeat of the Liberals was viewed with alarm in Ottawa, where neither the Liberal party of Prime Minister King nor the Conservative party opposition feel kindly disposed to the Union Nationale. Although some of its members were former Conservatives, the Union Nationale and the Conservatives in other provinces have drawn widely apart on the issue of the extent of Canada's participation in the war.

While Quebec's voters were giving this rebuke to Godbout's policy of cooperation with the Federal war program, they sharply repudiated the nationalistic Bloc Populaire, a new party which, campaigning against "imperialism" and participation in "foreign wars," won only four seats.

The Socialist Cooperative Commonwealth Federation, fresh from success in eastern Canada, elected 24 candidates in its first venture into Quebec, but won only one seat in a minority constituency.

Women Vote for First Time

With Quebec's women voting for the first time in a general election, and with weather fair throughout the province, a record number of more than one million votes was cast, nearly double the previous high of 563,257 votes in 1939.

Rioting broke out in a French section of Montreal during the voting when rival Liberal and Union Nationale sympathizers clashed in the streets. Pistols were fired and several were injured and 71 arrested before order was restored.

Duplessis pledged himself today to "carry on a policy which will help Quebec to recover its rights over its province relinquished during the past few years."

Capitalists on both sides of the border during the campaign he capitalized on the Union Nationale's traditional isolationism by attacking federal and provincial wartime restrictions on each other's local headquarters. Duplessis first took office as premier in 1936, ending 20 years of Liberal rule. Shortly after Canada declared war in 1939 he called for a general election to renew his mandate, declaring that Federal wartime measures were encroaching on provincial autonomy, but he was soundly defeated by Godbout's Liberals who won 70 of the 84 seats then comprising the Legislature.

Duplessis, Godbout and Andre Laurendeau, 32-year-old leader of the Bloc Populaire, all were elected from their own constituencies yesterday.

Army Guards Ride Cars

Meanwhile, armed guards continued to ride every bus, trolley and subway-elevated today as the Army studied reports of 15,000 employees who showed up for work Monday on the first day in a mining community.

An Army spokesman said the figure—low compared with the daily absentee average of 600—included "many who may be able to present medical certificates or other valid reasons for their absence due to vaccination."

In the first disputation of the strike which formed the walkout, James J. Fitzsimon, international president of the I. W. O. U., said P. T. C. workers voted on July 15, two weeks before the walkout, to go on a strike over the company's upgrading of 12 Negroes.

July 25, Fitzsimon said, adding that both were taken on company property.

Fails to Shatter Truckers' Strike

Harrisburg, Pa., Aug. 8.—(P)—Ordered back to work by their own union officials, and threatened in Lancaster with "worse or fight," 774 truck drivers today moved out on the fourth day of a strike that was held in material in the York, Lancaster and Harrisburg areas.

A three-hour conference held last night between Army and Navy officials, Federal representatives, and union leaders failed to shatter the deadlock that has called for the Brotherhood of Teamsters, Chauffeurs, Warehousemen, and Helpers, (AFL) at midnight Saturday.

Following last night's meeting Samuel Leiter, of the Harrisburg local, said "the situation remains about the same, with the outcome depending on further conference."

Ask Men To Return

Letter, along with Leon Blar, York representative, and McGee, Lancaster representative, asked the men to go back to work operators at a later date.

"If you can get them working here as a settlement in the near future through proper channels," said Leiter.

Union officials say the strike was called as a protest against a delay in granting pay increases approved by the War Labor Board in June. The operators argued from the directive of the WLB and on July 6 the truckers took a strike vote. It received 67.5 per cent approval.

Secretary Thomas M. Havens, of the Harrisburg operators said the WLB directive had been rejected and the drivers offered the Little Steel formula of 15 per cent over their 1943 salaries but added "we haven't received an acceptance of our offer."

Appeal for Review Of Auto Dispute

Detroit, Aug. 8.—(P)—The United Automobile Workers (UAW) appealed to the National War Labor Board today to review a dispute which has prevented the issuance of a strike against 7,000 employees in five plants of General Motors, Chrysler and Ford divisions of General Motors Corp.

Walter B. Reuther, UAW vice president in charge of the union's General Motors department, said he had written WLB Chairman William H. Davis that formal petitions for review would be filed immediately.

Charity Cost Lower Here

About \$420 Less Than Month Before, \$1,000 Less Than a Year Ago.

Charity costs in Manchester for the month of July were \$2,069.46 or \$420.24 less than June, and about \$1,000 less than July 1943.

There were 56 cases and 78 persons cared for by the town which is the same number of cases as last month, but three less persons. The total cost for June was \$3,389.70.

The reason for the reduction was that there were fewer hospital cases. A year ago there were 74 cases, or 18 more than last month and the number of persons was 92. The cost a year ago was \$3,977.35.

A hearing will be held in the probate court here on September 2 in an effort to learn who are the heirs of the estate of Clarence J. Todd, who died suddenly at his home on London street on May 13, 1940. He left no will and the estate of this case is valued at \$10,700. Most of this came to him from his late wife, Mrs. James A. Bidwell. An effort has been made to locate his relatives and as far as can be learned there are six blood relatives who are said to be his cousins. One is located in Nebraska. All must be notified of the hearing and given an opportunity to prove that they are entitled to their share.

Approximately 28,000 Idle in Dispute

The Associated Press said that 28,000 workers are idle in a dispute in the United States and Canada.

Four work stoppages accounted for more than two-thirds of approximately 28,000 idle today in labor disputes in the United States and Canada.

These four involving some 19,000 were:

- Five plants of General Motors' Great Lakes division, Detroit, 7,000; midwest over-the-road truck drivers in at least four states, possibly eight states, an estimated 5,000; Wright Aeronauts and Co., aircraft plants, Paterson, N. J., 4,000; and a steel mill, 2,000.
- Nine thousand more were idle in 18 other disputes across the nation.

Protest Over Suspension

Latest stoppage was a walkout of 130 tool makers and grinders at the Dodge main plant, making engines for B-29 Superfortresses, in what a company spokesman said was a protest over a three-day suspension of a worker for refusing to take orders.

As settled, however, was a stoppage since July 25 of 500 glass cutters at Ball Bros. Co., Mansfield, an AFL-CIO jurisdictional dispute. They returned to work yesterday.

Workers May Lose Old Age Deductions

Many Thousands Will Go Back into Non-Covered Occupations Or Retirement.

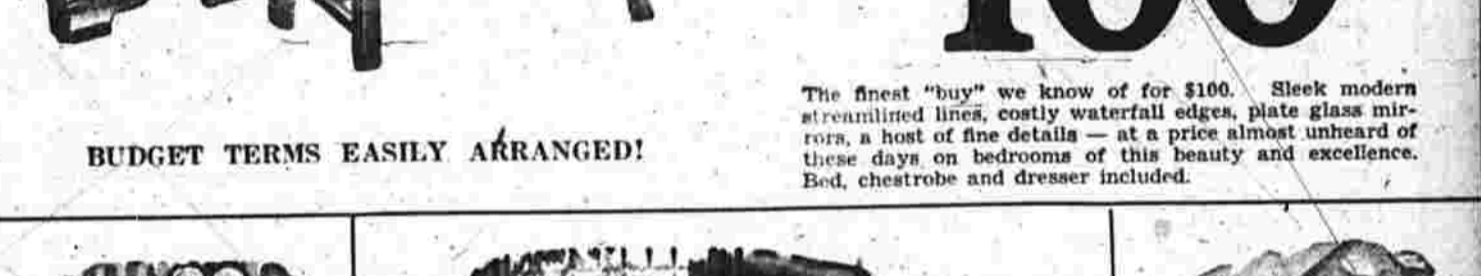
