

The amount of benefits paid depends upon the worker's average monthly wage up to \$250 a month. But when it comes to unemployment compensation, that is not so regular a picture. Unemployment compensation — money paid to workers who are out of work — is handled on a state basis instead of by the Federal government.

The payments by the various states average about \$13 a week. But here are two men from Mississippi. Two years ago one went to California to a war plant, the other went to Michigan to a war plant. Now they lose their jobs both return to Mississippi. They
get paid by the states in which
they had worked—California and
Michigan—Provided they had
worked in those states long enough worked in those states long enough to qualify for unemployment pay.

Back in Mississippi they report to their local U. S. employment service that they are out of jobs. The U. S. E. S. notifies California and Michigan. Both states send those workers the rate of unemployment pay prevailing in those states. All tates have an agreement on this kind of payment, so long as the U. S. E. S. can not find a job suitable for the unemployed.

Some workers are not covered at all by unamployment pay.
