Moscow, Aug. 14.—(AP)—The zero hour for an all-out Soviet assault on East Prussia appeared to be approaching rapidly today as Russian Armies massed in a great threatening area before the borders of that German province...

Washington, Aug. 14.—(AP)—Senator Andrew (D-Pa.) reported today that officials of the United States, Cuba and Mexico are talking up a new, "good neighbor super-highway" one featuring two water hops via ferries.

Major Victory Possible. General Eisenhower, in an order of the day to his troops this morning, told them they were "not only to be victorious but to be the victors."

On that basis, General Eisenhower asked for unusual efforts from all branches of the service. "With all our resolutely performing our special tasks," he said, "we can make this week a momentous one in the history of our war."

General Eisenhower's high hope and urgent appeal are based. As we know the situation, the American army is in a position to trap to that German Army. Responding to that threat, General von Kluge yesterday gave a general retreat, sending back to the Paris.

So far as we know, there is still a gap between the German and our forces. At 18 miles wide, for a complete triumph, we need only a few more miles. Our forces are strongly defended. But without closing the gap itself, we still should be able to exact a heavy price from the Germans.

There seems only one important danger ahead of this agreement. It must be submitted to Congress for approval. Under previous procedure, by which the UNRRA was approved, it could be submitted to Congress as an "agreement" and approved by a simple majority vote in both houses.

It is that should be the necessary procedure. It is relatively easy to contemplate the possibility that American oil interests decide that they do not want to play the game by the principles of this agreement, could muster the necessary one-third of the Senate membership in a role of amendment, reservation, obstruction and finally defeat for the agreement.

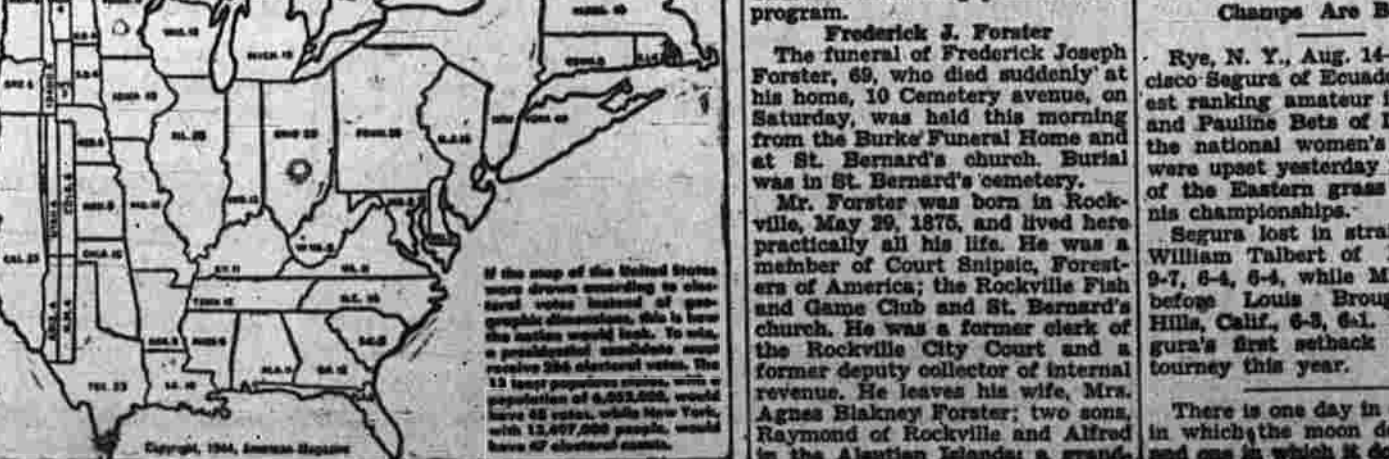
