

4,446 Strikes Occur Since New Act Legal

By Mary Beard

Greater Number of The Home Nurse Few Follow Peacetime Formula.

Washington, Aug. 21—(P)—In a year's operation of the war labor disputes (Smith-Connally) act, designed to end wartime work stoppages, 4.446 strikes have occurred. The greater number of these have been of the impromptu variety, of which the act takes little account.

Most wartime strikes are, relatively, of the spontaneous variety. Few of them, like the coal strikes, follow the peacetime formula where a strong union leadership coolly plans to close down a plant the day the contract expires if demands for a new contract are not met.

Tied to Emotions

The spontaneous strikes are tied to emotions and tempers involving the boss or the government, but symptom.

On the 30th day the employes are to vote on whether they want to strike.

A majority voted to strike in all but 41 of these elections. Dr. John R. Steelman, director of the U. S. Conciliation service, has observed, however, that strikes following such elections are very infrequent. "Those who use that procedure." he says, "generally weren't going to strike in the first place.
