Moscow, Aug. 31.—(AP)—The Red Army was believed today to have entered Bucharest, capital of Romania, after capturing the great Ploesti oil fields and preempting perhaps a third of the German petroleum supply. At midnight, the Russians were 17 miles from the city of 648,000 after an advance of nearly 40 miles in a day through the capitulated Balkan mountains.

Manchester Folks Eating Quantity of Native Meat

Manchester people have been eating a lot of native meat for the past year, as shown by the report of the health department, filed today with the Selectmen. Dr. Richard Olmstead, the meat and market inspector, reports that he examined the carcasses of 1,288 animals killed for food and as a result of the increased business it was necessary to engage an assistant to be present at the killing of 788 animals and seeing that they were properly stamped.

The report in detail is as follows: To the Honorable Board of Selectmen: The Board of Health of the Town of Manchester herewith submits its annual report.

At their October meeting the Selectmen appointed Dr. D. C. Y. Moore a member of the Board of Health for a period of three years. The organization meeting of the Board of Health was held October 18, 1943, with Dr. D. C. Y. Moore, chairman; Mrs. Emma L. Nettleton, secretary and David Chambers, public health inspector. The following appointments were made for a period of one year: Miss Jessie M. Reynolds, Contagious Disease Nurse; Mrs. Alice D. Johnson, clerk.

In the letter Corporal Johnson said that shells were bursting all around in the immediate neighborhood and that he helped to dig the foxhole he had taken shelter in. He reminded his father that he ate when the opportunity came and apparently liked it.

Corporal Johnson has been in the service about a year and a half and has been overseas about six weeks. Previous to entering the service he was a student at the Bordentown, N. J., Military Academy.
