Phosphorous Grenades Hurled Then the Germans hurled phosphorous grenades through the windows and soon the whole village was a huge bonfire with a great pall of black smoke ascending from it.

The SS battallon withdrew to the outskirts of the community, shooting and killing some men who had broken from the hoases and were attempting to run into the fields.

There are bloodstains on the walls and floors of the wrecked church, school and houses. All the bodies later were collected and buried in common graves.

The phosphorous grenades generated such heat that crucinxes and other metal fixtures of the church melted and poured in rivulets over the floor, then hardened. Statues still stand in wall alches, but are charred and borken. The attars are black and chipped.

Die Hugging Children

Some women died hugging children to their breasts. Other infants died in their baby carriages, the twisted steel wreckages of which are still in the church.

These details came from the seven survivors who are sane. Their accounts were gathered by Commandant Marchel, chief of the French Forces of the Interior of the Limoges region, and supported by photos taken of the bodies before burial.



Another Side to Picture And there was another side to the picture. The German firm had the picture. The German firm had such a monopoly on the metal production in Europe that if France or England wanted some of that metal for armament, it had to buy from the German firm which could sell or refuse to sell.

By refusing, it crippled French or British armament. If it sold, then the German high command knew what kind of war or defense preparations its European neighknew what kind of war or derense preparations its European neighbors were making.

It's possible, but don't bet on it, that cartels will be wiped out. But a different kind of cartel is in the making. It isn't called a cartel. It's called a trade agreement among governments. among governments.

And its purpose is different from
the commercial cartel. The latter,
seeking to monopolize world trade.

can keep all purchasers at its mercy.

Intended to Stabilize Trade
The government cartel is intended to stabilize international trade and protect the producers of the countries taking part in the cartel.

Here's an example:
The United States, Australia, Canada and Argentina in 1942 made a wheat agreement to prevent a drop in wheat prices. This agreement goes into operation soon after the war ends. It may be followed by a world agreement.

The present agreement will work like this: Each of the four countries will sell abroad only a certain percentage of the world trade in wheat: Argentina, 25; Australia, 19; Canada, 40; and the United States, 16.

This country also has agreements on coffee and oil.

Much remains to be worked out

Much remains to be worked out on this in the years ahead. Other products are likely to be covered by similar agreements.
