

Leaders Seen Meeting Soon

(The following officers of the military operations in the Pacific, consideration of the role Russia is to play, and the timing of the demobilization of the United States Army and Navy, are among the subjects to be discussed.)

With the presidential campaign under way in the United States, and the consequent danger of any conference becoming embroiled in political issues, the feeling among many London observers is that Roosevelt and Churchill must meet outside the United States.

While military operations are at their most satisfactory state of the entire war, the diplomatic field offers multiple possibilities for rupture.

Satellites Suing for Peace

Romania, Bulgaria and Finland, three of Hitler's satellites, are suing for peace. Roosevelt and Churchill are certain to be kept informed of all developments before terms are signed.

One of the latest moves affecting the two leaders is presented by Poland. Both the United States and Britain are standing behind the exiled Polish government, while Russia supports the Polish Committee of National Liberation, already set up in that country.

As the Allies close in on Japan, the possibility of further cooperation of all commands in the Pacific—even placing all under one supreme command similar to Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower in Europe—may be discussed.

Women's Equal Rights Snagged in Congress

Amendment First Introduced in 1923 Not Getting Any Real Consideration Yet.

By James Marlow

Washington, Sept. 8.—(AP)—Women in this country have fought for equal rights with men since they secured their first women's rights convention in 1848, which was 86 years ago.

Many had thought they finally were within reach of what they wanted. Now it is not sure they will get it after all.

Among their other demands in 1848 they started their campaign for the right of women to vote. They finally got that through a constitutional amendment in 1920.

It seems sure they would have equal rights on all grounds.

The Every Proposal Dies

Not all Congressmen are convinced it is a good idea. Now are all women convinced it is a good idea, even women who fought for the right of women to vote.

In order for the amendment to become part of the constitution this would be necessary:

It would have to pass both Houses by a two-thirds vote. Then it would have to be approved by the Legislatures of three-fourths of the 48 states, or a total of 36 states.

And even with that the amendment as written would not become law for five years after it had been approved by the states. The reason for this delay is to give the states time to repeal laws which advocates of the amendment consider discriminatory against women now.

All this may be a pessimistic view of the amendment's chances at this time. It certainly is pessimistic when compared with the hopes expressed by leaders of the National Woman's party at its headquarters here.

Months ago the Senate Judiciary committee, which considered the equal rights proposal finally gave it the nod and moved it up for debate and vote on the Senate floor. It still hasn't reached there.

Senator Gillette (D-Ia.) has hoped to bring it up for debate in the Senate next week. It may not come up until after election day in November, if then.

Anxious to Avoid Strife

Congress members are anxious to avoid bitter struggles between Democrats and Republicans over the amendment.

Quake Insurance Not Being Sought

Hartford, Sept. 8.—(AP)—Executives of surety companies in this insurance center report that only a mild flurry of inquiries about earthquake insurance followed the temblor that shook the northeastern United States and part of Canada early Tuesday.

Most of the insurance of this type in force in the United States is held on the Pacific coast where the destruction caused by the 1906 earthquake is still remembered. In 1934, earthquake insurance premiums amounted to \$1,000,000 and only \$24,000 was paid in losses.

The nature of the risk makes for an uneven loss experience, however, insurance officials said. Protection against earthquake damage is not included in the standard fire insurance policies, but it is obtainable under an extended coverage endorsement.
