39 Persons Killed In Atlantic Storm; \$53,000,000 Loss

Tail-end of Hurricane Reported Today to Be Blowing Across Canadian Maritime Provinces; Deaths in Connecticut Increased to 6

At least 39 persons lost their lives in the hurricane which swept up the Atlantic coast Thursday, causing damage estimated between \$30,000,000 and \$53,000,000 in northeastern coastal states.

The fall end of the storm was reported today to be blowing across Canadian maritime provinces and losing its force, although causing some damage in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick.

Two new deaths were reported today when the bodies of a man and a woman were washed up at Beach Haven, N. J., to increase New Jersey's hurricane death toll to five. The storm took 15 lives in New England states where extensive property damage occurred in coastal sections. New York's loss of life stood at 17 with one death each for Virginia and North Carolina.

When facilities were disrupted at the Army's Col. Thomas M. Halloran General Hospital at Atlantic City, more than 1,000 wounded, most from European and Pacific fronts, were evacuated to Halloran General Hospital in New York.

6 Deaths Reported In Connecticut

The hurricane death toll in Connecticut was counted at six today with the addition of two more victims both of whom were killed by electric shock.

The body of Clifford Ongley, 42, superintendent of the White Memorial Foundation in Litchfield, was found last evening in the yard of his home where he had touched a charged wire while fixing up debris.

Salvatore DeRosa, 12, fell from his bicycle in Stamford yesterday and struck a live transformer, carrying 2,400 volts, lying on the ground.

The others killed were: Michael Waldron of New Haven, electric shock; Frank Schofield, 40, of Bethany, killed by an automobile in Naugatuck during the storm; Merton R. Darrow, of Niantic, drowned in the Niantic river, and

Urge Access To All News

Both Parties Ready to Unite for Freedom Of Press and Radio.

Washington, Sept. 16.—(AP)—A proposal favoring the protection by international treaty of the right to have independent access to the news of all nations as a means of preserving future peace drew the attention of the Senate Foreign Relations committee today.

Chairman Connally (D-Tex.) sought speedy indorsement of a resolution with a view to calling it up on the floor for action next Tuesday.

With both the Republican and Democratic parties committed to the advocacy of world-wide interchange of independent news as a powerful weapon to combat misunderstandings which lead to wars, Connally expressed hope of a quick agreement on language.

Connally's committee had for consideration a resolution of his own asserting congressional belief in the right of the responsible press and radio to "write, send and publish news at uniform communication rates and without interference by governmental or private monopoly."

Free Press Guarantees

It would put Congress on record as advocating the writing of free press guarantees into the coming peace treaty or into the treaty creating an international peace organization.

Signing countries would be pledged to give the responsible press and radio of all nations involved "the same access to information at the source and the same freedom from censorship" that their own national newspapers are accorded.

Also under consideration by the committee is a similar resolution by Senator Taft (R-Ohio) suggesting a declaration favoring opening "all channels of news throughout the world" and suggesting that "the complete absence of censorship and the removal of discrimination in the use of facilities of communication will contribute to the knowledge of all peoples, nullify the effect

German Robot Bombs Again Over London

Government Repeats Its Warning That Danger From Flying Weapons Is Not Yet Passed.

London, Sept. 16.—(AP)—German robot bombs which may have been launched from airplanes smashed into southern England and the London area shortly before dawn today, underscoring the government's warning that evacuees should not flood back to the capital.

One flying bomb wrecked seven houses. In one of them five children and an adult were killed outright. Four others in the same area were seriously injured.

It was the first such attack in more than two weeks.

Some persons here said the bombs appeared to be the type discharged from aircraft. A few flying bombs previously are said to have come from the east on pick-up-back planes. This form of attack could be carried out from airfields in the heart of Germany.

Last Raid on Aug. 31

Allied armies are overrunning most of the coastal regions of the continent from which the flying bombs were first launched, but the Germans still hold Calais, Boulogne and Dunkerque on the French coast, unspecified areas on the Belgian coast and all the Netherlands coastal regions.

Only last night, Lord Woolton, minister of reconstruction, appealing to those who have been evacuated from London to stay put, declared "we should be foolish to assume that the enemy has exhausted his capacity to invent devilish instruments of destruction, which can be discharged from a safe distance, until the time when the R.A.F. finds out their hiding places."

Official Announcements

The official home security announcement of the robot raid said only "shortly before dawn there was some enemy activity with flying bombs over the southern countries, including the London area. Damage and casualties have been reported."

Meanwhile the German radio asserted a new secret weapon, radio controlled "explosion boats," had sunk 38 Allied ships and damaged 15 others in the English channel in recent weeks.

The new device was described as a light speedboat with high speed propellers, carrying an unarmored pilot with a lifeboat. At 200 yards from the target the pilot hits a button which thrusts him into the water and a command boat, by radio control, guides the explosive unit toward its target.

WLB to Ask Wage Change

Officials Believe That New Policy of Higher Pay Will Be Ordered.

Washington, Sept. 16.—(AP)—There was little doubt today that the War Labor Board, as swiftly as possible, would send direct or implied recommendations to the White House for a wage question—already a prime election issue—would reach President Roosevelt before Nov. 7, was virtually assured.

May Declare War on Nazis

Finland Is Moving to That Point Because of Acts of the Germans.

Stockholm, Sept. 16.—(AP)—Finland apparently was moving today toward a formal declaration of war against Germany, her former ally.

The Finnish newspaper Vaestara Nyland declared the "Nazi" invasion of the island of Suursaari (Hogland) in the Gulf of Finland had converted "the question of diplomatic relations into a direct act of war."

(A Finnish declaration of war on Germany is expected after the rupture of diplomatic relations between the two countries.)

Parliament to Meet

The Swedish foreign office confirmed that German troops intended to close the border of northern Finland effective today. Nazis' Extermination Camp Employed Women Torturers

London, Sept. 16.—(AP)—The notorious Majdanek extermination camp near Lublin had a torture staff that included German women whose specialty was torturing women prisoners, the Polish Soviet extraordinary commission for investigation of German crimes charged today.

A communication of the commission, broadcast from Moscow, asserted the camp had a capacity of 45,000 prisoners and a report sent to Berlin on a special occasion announced 18,000 executions in a single day.

The commission reported a total of 1,250,000 bodies were burned at the camp, 600,000 in special furnaces able to burn four bodies in 15 minutes; the legs and arms were chopped off, 300,000 on bon-

Dewey Set to Separate War Talk and Politics

But Nominee Gets Into An Argument Over Allocating of Supplies To General MacArthur

En Route West with Dewey, Sept. 16.—(AP)—Gov. Thomas E. Dewey walked a tight rope today between his attacks on the domestic policies of the New Deal and his expressed determination to keep the conduct of the war free from political discussion.

The Republican presidential nominee traveled toward northern Idaho for a round of conferences with Gov. C. A. Bottolfsen at Coeur d'Alene, leaving behind in Billings, Mont., conflicting impressions of his latest reference to the Pacific war effort.

Dewey told a news conference there yesterday he thought the conduct of the war should be kept out of the campaign, yet a few moments before he said allocations of supplies and men to Gen. Douglas MacArthur, the southwest Pacific commander, "is now being determined by the chiefs of staff."

The New York governor entered the MacArthur discussion as his special train sat on a dusty rail road siding at Valentine, Neb. Earlier in the week, he proposed that the talents of the man President Roosevelt called "Doc," at the Pearl Harbor conference be given wider scope in the drive against the Japanese, "since MacArthur is no longer a political threat" to the President.

His remarks then were prompted by reports that Mr. Roosevelt and Prime Minister Churchill might pick an over-all commander for the Pacific at their conference in Quebec.

Soviet Army Patrols Scout Nazi Positions In the Polish Capital

Moscow, Sept. 16.—(AP)—Red Army patrols have crossed the Vistula from captured Praga and scouted German positions at Warsaw while Russian and Polish troops hurried back the first Big Nazi armored attack upon their positions in the east bank suburb, field dispatches said today.

Eleven localities north of Praga were declared seized by Russian and Polish units, increasing the pressure upon Warsaw.

The patrols were reported to have brought back information on the disposition of Nazi defenses in the besieged Polish capital, but Moscow had no information on whether a crossing had been accomplished in force.

The Army newspaper Red Star said the Germans sent numerous tanks and self-propelled guns to aid their troops between the Vistula and the western Bug, "but nothing helped."

Severe Tank Warfare

Tank warfare in the Praga sector is becoming the most severe of the entire war. Most of the 119 tanks which the midnight Russian communiques reported destroyed were in the Praga area.

The Red Star dispatch said the blazing, smoking city of Warsaw was in full view of the Russian forces on the banks of the Vistula at Praga.

First photographs flown back from Praga to Moscow showed that many of Warsaw's buildings were shattered and where flames and smoke were not billowing the buildings looked gutted and ruined.

Reconnaissance disclosed that Red Army artillery and air power had already driven Nazi troops from a 100-yard strip between the west bank of the Vistula and the first line of buildings in Warsaw.

On Other Fronts

Meanwhile there was reason here to believe that violent fighting was breaking out in many new sectors of the eastern front, with the initiative completely with the Red Army.

Preparations were said to be complete for the Russians' autumn and winter campaign. It was believed to be only a matter of days before German forces from Finland and Yugoslavia will bear the brunt of drives by veteran Russian Armies, refreshed and eager to march into the Reich.

First Army Has Also Deepened Two Other Wedges in the Line And Made a Fourth Crossing of Frontier; Supreme Headquarters Says Heavier Fortifications Are Still Ahead.

London, Sept. 16.—(AP)—American First Army troops surged through a 10-mile breach in the main Siegfried line east of encircled Aachen today, deepened two other wedges in the system and made a fourth crossing of the German frontier. Their assaults were part of a grand Allied drive which supreme headquarters said was thrusting eastward along a curving 600-mile front from the Swiss frontier south of Belfort to the channel coast around the Scheldt estuary near the Dutch border.

Although there was no doubt that the main steel and concrete defenses of the Siegfried line had been breached, supreme headquarters took the official view that most of the line's strategic strength ahead of the U. S. First Army spearhead which was driving down the last 30 miles toward Cologne and the Rhine river and pointed toward Berlin 315 miles away.

It was said to be difficult to tell immediately when the American troops actually were through the last of the deep defense zone. At least one more belt of minefields, pillboxes and gunposts may be found west of the Rhine, and Aachen itself, the first great fortress center to be pinched out and a guardian of the invasion route to the German capital along the northern European plain, was closed in a lightning from ring and appeared about to fall.

Fighting Inside City

German broadcasts said there was fighting inside the city, indicating that the American cleanup assault had broken through its last line of defense.

A front line dispatch said Field Marshal Gen. Karl Rudolf Gerd von Rundstedt, the German strategic commander, was believed to have returned as the top German commander in the west, apparently replacing Field Marshal Gen. Walter von Model.

Both Field Marshal Gen. Guehrer and Field Marshal Gen. Erwin Rommel were reported to be in the battle for Normandy. Von Kluge now is reported dead and Rommel is said to be seriously injured. Model was reported in command only a few days ago.

Front reports previously placed the German frontier was made 63 miles south of Aachen and east of the Luxembourg city of Diekirch. It is midway between the cross-border drives near Trier and Prüm which already have buckled the Siegfried line system.

Wallendorf Captured

Wallendorf, one mile inside Germany, was captured. A front dispatch said it was reported at U. S. Third Army headquarters that every building in Wallendorf was burned yesterday because of persistent sniping and that a nearby village was subjected to a similar searching for the same reason.

The German radio said German and American forces clashed heavily east of the Sure river in the direction of Bitburg, 12 miles inside the German frontier. Bitburg is 15 miles northwest of Trier. Front reports previously placed American units 10 miles inside Germany in that general area.
