Navy Leaves Enemy to Confusion; Only Mention of Philippines in MacArthur's Report of Blows at Shipping Preceding Raid on Capital

U. S. Pacific Fleet Headquarters, Pearl Harbor, Sept. 23.—(AP)—Tokyo radio broadcast Japan's growing alarm over implications of the first American carrier blast at Manila, filling the airways with "invasion" speculation—even reporting the Philippines puppet government had been set up on the United States.

Enemy Reports Unconfirmed Last night's communiqué, the first since disclosure that carrier planes knocked out 105 aircraft and 37 ships at Manila Sept. 20 (U. S. date) contained no mention of any report that the attacks continued Thursday.

Only mention of the Philippines was made in today's communiqué of Gen. Douglas MacArthur's report of air blows at Japanese shipping off Mindanao covered attacks which preceded the Manila raids.

Montreal—So long as wartime controls over raw materials and manufactured commodities persist, the United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration will have effective control over food, clothing, medical and sanitation and rehabilitation supplies going into the war-stricken areas. It is UNRRA's intention that until any of these can look after itself, all relief will be an average of 50 percent a day—adjusted for age, health and type of work, in individual cases. This is the standard for the peoples it will help. It will be UNRRA's to bring the food supply to each country up from whatever may be its indigenous level to the 50-percent standard.

This France, which has been so hard hit that had been expected, will receive smaller food rations per person than Greece or Poland—or, if Italy is to be aided, than Italy. The same standard will be given all the same standard of eating.

Allied military authorities are carrying the burden of relief and rehabilitation for the first six months after each area is liberated from the Nazis. For that reason, UNRRA has not yet been called upon to administer actual assistance anywhere yet.

UNRRA's schedules are based upon taking over assistance areas as the six-month military administration is terminated. And UNRRA's procurement has been planned so as to set aside, for its seasonal procurement, food which is not available when need arises plus commodities which have to be replaced in advance, leaving until later those which presumably can be procured on short notice at almost any time.

### Butter Supply Will Lay Low

Washington, Sept. 23.—(AP)—The War Food administration notified butter manufacturers yesterday that beginning in October it will require no setting aside of butter for government purchase until next spring.

Although the entire output of butter starting Oct. 1 will go to the War Food administration, the WFA advised that seasonal low production and butter factories will keep the domestic supply for the American table far below demand for the remainder of this year.

Since April the government has required manufacturers to set aside from 10 to 50 percent of their production for lend-lease and military uses.

Indications are, WFA said, that there will be no surplus of dairy products when the war with Germany ends, the armed forces and our Allies will continue to need huge supplies and there are few if any reserves.

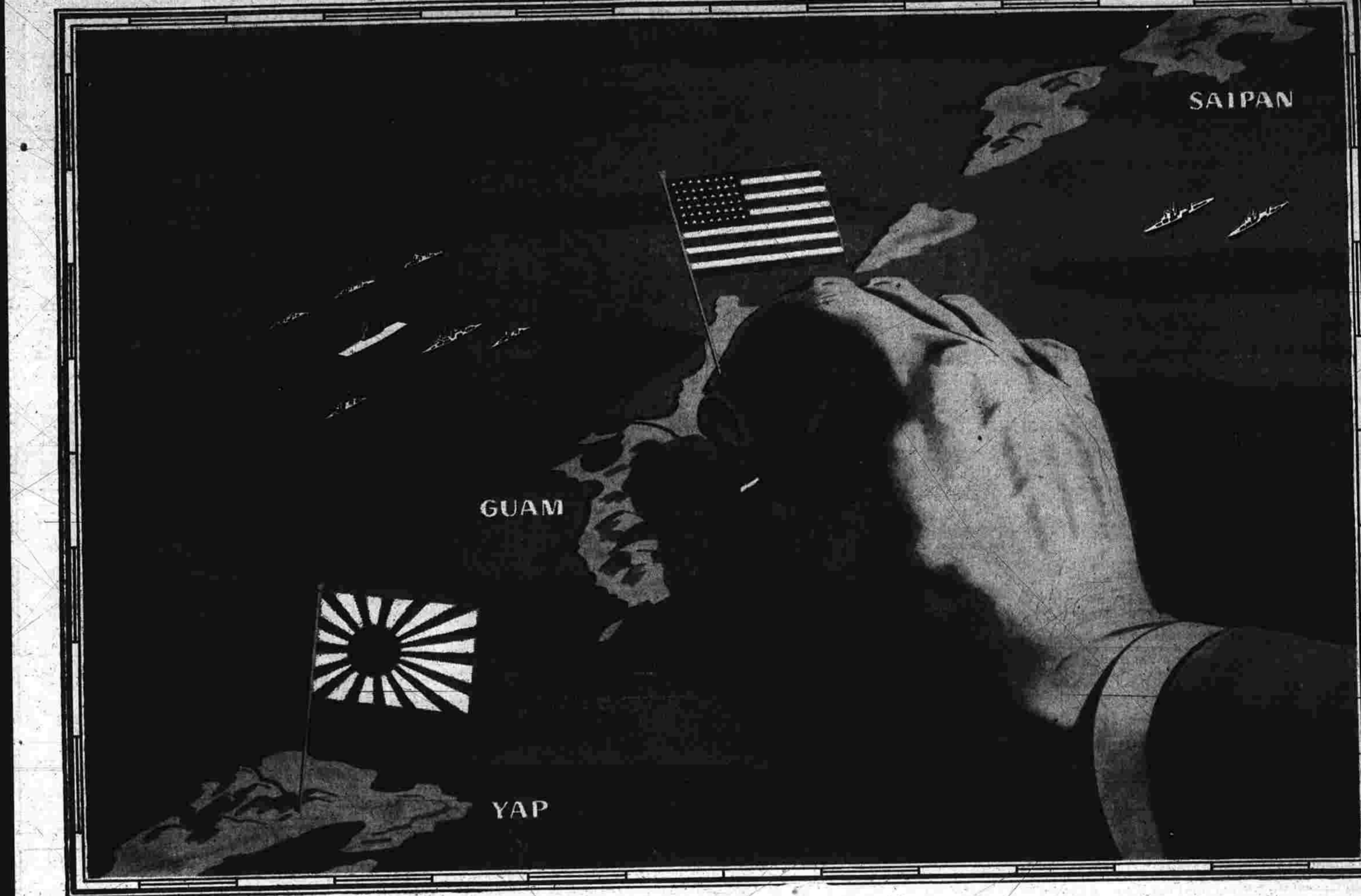
