Firms Slowly Ousting Nazis
Making Steady Progress to Fulfill Red Armistice Terms Now.

Helinski, Sept. 25.—Finnish troops, undertaking a task they considered as impossible, are reported making slow but steady progress today in their efforts to drive the Germans out of northern Finland and fulfill the terms of the armistice with Russia which this country has received with mingled hope and fear.

Front line reports said American paratroopers attached to the British second Army had taken Beek, Dutch border village three miles southeast of Nijmegen and only about eight miles northwest of Kleve, and those troops, too, were fighting in Germany. Beek is five or six miles north of where the entry into the Reichswald area was made.

Advance 10 Miles
To the west of the British corridor, Canadian, Canadian and British advanced 10 miles on the night of Sept. 24, from Turnhout canal, setting a bridgehead across the canal about eight miles northeast of Antwerp, and entered Turnhout about 20 miles northeast of Antwerp.
