No Limit on Spending To Educate Disabled

Government Pays All Expenses, No Matter How Much, for Maximum of Four Years.

(Editor's Note: This is the result of a survey on veterans' education expenses from donations by jobs and pensions.)

Washington, Oct. 3.—There is no limit on the money the government will spend to educate a disabled war veteran so long as he can make a living.

These men pay all their school and training expenses, no matter how much, for a maximum of four years.

For example: An ex-Marine, although blind, is taking a two-year course in a university. There will be no limit on the money the government will spend to help him.

Called Vocational Training. This program for disabled veterans is called vocational training. They can go to a university, technical school, shop, laboratory or any place where they can learn something with which to hold a job.

This is how the program, operated by the Veterans' Administration, works.

The veteran must have served between Sept. 16, 1916, and the end of the war, been honorably discharged, and have a pensionable disability due to, or aggravated by, his military service.

Disability ranges from ailments, blindness and deafness to amputations and blindness.

Under the program, the government ends six years after the war. The disabled veteran can ask for the training any time up until then.

During his period of schooling or training, no matter how small his pension is—he receives no less than \$25 a month if single, \$30.00 if married, \$35.70 monthly for each dependent child, and \$15.00 for each dependent parent.

He will continue to get that amount for the first two months after he has finished school and found employment.

(This vocational training program, limited to disabled veterans, is not to be confused with the general educational and training program which almost any veteran can get.)

Can File Claim Immediately. A veterans' administration man is at a school, all the Army and Navy hospitals so that a veteran, at the moment of his discharge, can immediately file a claim for disability.

Evangelical Fellowship Chapter Organized at New Haven Meeting.

New Haven, Oct. 4.—(P)—The Connecticut chapter of the Episcopal Evangelical Fellowship was organized here last night with the Rev. Charles Lawson Willard, rector of Trinity church on the green, as president.

Rev. Richard Millard of St. James's church, Danbury, was elected secretary-treasurer, and an executive committee chosen which included: The Rev. Raymond Cunningham, Trinity church, Hartford; the Rev. Stanley P. Hemmery, St. John's church, Stamford; the Rev. Samuel A. Huddle, Christ church, Waterbury; the Rev. George L. Fitzgerald, St. James the Apostle church, New

Haven; Miss Elizabeth Keith, Trinity church, New Haven; and Murray Franklin, St. John's church, Stamford.

To Study Protestant Heritage. The Rev. Gardner M. Day of Christ church, Cambridge, Mass., president of the national fellowship, as principal speaker told representatives of 20 Connecticut Protestant Episcopal churches who attended the meeting at Trinity church house, that an object of the fellowship is "to study the Protestant heritage" which "comes down to us from the reformation."

He said that heritage includes the conception of God as father of all people and ruler over and above all institutions, including those of the divided Christian churches.

Mr. Day also said the fellowship would "work for approval of the Episcopal church on the proposed concordat with the Presbyterian church," a liberal and just revision of the marriage canon, and the allowance of "more latitude in the use of the creeds books."

Called Vocational Training. This program for disabled veterans is called vocational training. They can go to a university, technical school, shop, laboratory or any place where they can learn something with which to hold a job.

This is how the program, operated by the Veterans' Administration, works.

The veteran must have served between Sept. 16, 1916, and the end of the war, been honorably discharged, and have a pensionable disability due to, or aggravated by, his military service.

Disability ranges from ailments, blindness and deafness to amputations and blindness.

Under the program, the government ends six years after the war. The disabled veteran can ask for the training any time up until then.

During his period of schooling or training, no matter how small his pension is—he receives no less than \$25 a month if single, \$30.00 if married, \$35.70 monthly for each dependent child, and \$15.00 for each dependent parent.

He will continue to get that amount for the first two months after he has finished school and found employment.

(This vocational training program, limited to disabled veterans, is not to be confused with the general educational and training program which almost any veteran can get.)

Can File Claim Immediately. A veterans' administration man is at a school, all the Army and Navy hospitals so that a veteran, at the moment of his discharge, can immediately file a claim for disability.

The military and medical records there are sent to one of eight regional offices. Each office has a board composed of a lawyer, doctor and occupational specialist.

This board decides three things: The amount of pension the veteran should get, the degree of his disability, and whether that disability is ready a vocational handicap.

If it is considered a handicap, at the time he is notified about the amount of pension to be allowed, he is sent an application with which he can ask for vocational rehabilitation, a fancy word for vocational training or schooling.

If he wants the rehabilitation, he files the application with the regional office. Then he confers with vocational counselors.
