Not surprised at Opposition Truman smilingly told reporters he was "not surprised" that the association subsequently adopted a resolution reaffirming its long-standing opposition to "so-called valley or regional authorities."

"I think they made a mistake," he said. "They took the same position with reference to the Tennessee Valley authority. Projects should be judged on the basis of their economic soundness, tried to give them a hint to reform."

District Tax Paid by U. S.

Checks Will Soon Be Received for Orford Village, Silver Lane.

Summer K. Wiley, Regional Director of the Federal Public Housing Authority, National Housing Agency, has notified the Housing Authority of the Town of Manchester that a check for the South Manchester Fire District for \$2,326.15 will soon be mailed by the United States Treasury Department. This amount represents payments in lieu of taxes on War Housing Projects, Orford Village and Silver Lane Homes. These payments in lieu of taxes are being made for the years 1942 and 1943, the 1944 tax in the amount of \$27.79 has already been paid to the Fire District.

The Federal Public Housing Authority, in accordance with the provisions of law, makes payments in lieu of taxes covering war housing projects. Such payments are based on valuations established by the Federal Public Housing Authority in cooperation with local taxing authorities and are determined by applying the local tax rate.

A portion of the amount of \$23,206.94 was made for the years 1942 and 1943, the 1944 tax year Oct. 1, 1943 to Oct. 1, 1944.

Hartford, Oct. 13.—Mayor Mortenson disclosed today that plans for a \$10,000,000 slum clearance project for Hartford will be analyzed and discussed at a round table conference in Hotel Bond at 12:15 p. m., Tuesday, Oct. 24.

An spokesman for the Reconstruction Development company, which represents a group of New York city banks and contractors, Eugene Greenhut, will be present at the conference, which is a pre-arranged program.

The major topic pointed out by the housing survey by the National Housing agency, now under way, should show what areas need to be rebuilt and the housing needs of Hartford citizens. He added that under the proposed plan clearance plan more than 2,000 Hartford families would be taken out of blighted areas and rehoused in sanitary, fire-proof apartment buildings, which would not only provide modern housing accommodations but would also be served by public transportation, shopping facilities.

Capt. Fred Keish Home From Burma and China

Flier Returns After 15 Months Tough Air Fighting Over Jungles; Won Coveted Medals.

Capt. Frederick Keish, U. S. Army Air Force, arrived at his home yesterday after 15 months of tough fighting in the air over China and Burma. He wears on his flying jacket the famed insignia of the Flying Tigers, the China-Burma-India shoulder patch and on the breast of his shirt he wears the most coveted of all aviator awards short of the DSC and Medal of Honor—the Distinguished Flying Cross with one oak leaf cluster, the Air Medal with one cluster and two citations for gallant and valuable service to his own country and allied nations.

Capt. Keish received his primary training at Phoenix, Ariz., his basic at Maxwell, Ala., and his advanced training at Ft. Belvoir, Colorado. He took Army Air Force combat crew members are worthy of Army Air Force fine traditions.

C. L. Chennault, Major General U. S. Army, Commanding General, China Flying Wing, besides his vital mission over Burma last year, Captain Keish has participated in a bombing run on Hongkong, Shanghai in China and in the Philippines. He has been on many raids off the coast of China clipping Jap coastal shipping and on the coast of North Burma. Flying on a bombing mission over a special target, Captain Keish and his crew of four, including himself, his three co-pilots of the four-engine bomber lost their plane over a hostile territory.

Let It Fracture
"The other nine members of the crew bailed out one by one in order," declared Captain Keish today as he home, resting in his 17,000 mile flight home from the China front. When he came in to land, he was hit by a rough weather, sustaining a compound fracture of his right leg.

"I came down in the mountains of Burma, five minutes from the top line and 200 miles from the Burma Road and close by a small mission station."

"It was so stunning that I lay in the woods for a whole day without moving. I managed to crawl through enough strength to get a crutch from a tea house and my parachute and struggled down into a native village some distance from the crash site."

Each China-Burma-India flier wears the Flying cross on his uniform as a badge of honor. Captain Keish's cross is adorned with the characteristic medals and ribbons of his service.
