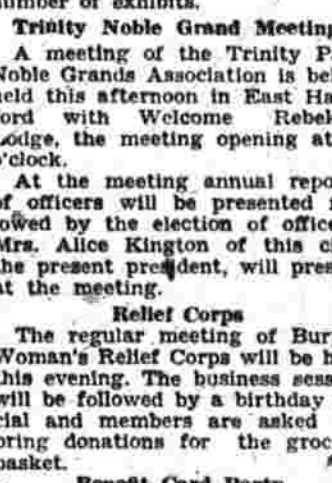

United troops of Generalissimo Chiang Kai-shek.

These troops and their Allied American forces, as has been pointed out, are dependent on a thin line of air-coast supplies from the "hump" from China. Some reports from China reflect apprehension that the present Japanese offensive is directed against the capture of strategic air stations on this line.

But even if the Japanese should not actually break the bridge of supplies they could serve their strategy well simply by broadening the coastal areas held to such a depth that when the American forces are finally ready to reach advanced island bases into China they will be forced to do so without the aid of Chinese armies.

This would vastly complicate the Allied task and doubtless delay its accomplishment beyond the time which has been hoped for. The hope being based on the belief that Chinese armies would be able to fight toward the coast from the interior at the same time that American invasion troops strike from the sea.

Havana Damaged Heavily by Hurricane

Havana, Oct. 18.—(AP)—Havana was heavily damaged by a tropical hurricane early today, but first reports showed no casualties.

Hours after the center of the disturbance passed northward, the full fury of the storm, which paralyzed island communications and delayed official reports, was felt in the city.

The National Observatory sent messages to Havana for a major report by Army messenger, reporting the highest wind velocity in Havana to be 110 miles an hour.

Transportation Driven Aground

The 1,200-ton Cuban transport Columbia broke her mooring in Havana bay and was driven aground. No one was aboard the ship.

A 6 a. m. wind velocity in the city reached 60 miles an hour, ripping down telegraph and telephone wires.

The two principal radio chains broadcasting from Havana left the city early in the morning due to power failures. But several smaller stations continued operating.

Communications with the western end of the island were cut last night.

No Chance Seen Of State Being Hit

New Haven, Oct. 18.—(AP)—John B. Underwood, chief of the New Haven weather bureau, said today that "there is no chance at all that the southern hurricane now blowing around Havana and the Florida Keys will reach the section of the coast." Should the effects be felt in this area, he continues, they would be in the form of a heavy rainstorm, which would be welcome rather than troublesome.
