Great Navy Day

Never has there been such a Navy Day for celebration in our history as at home. There is some emphasis today, as the Battle of the Philippines devolves to its last pursuing bomb shots, upon the possibility that some of the Jap ships which have claimed damaged will live to fight again, as they probably will. It is emphasized by Secretary Forrestal, that Japan cannot afford to lose a fleet they need. We are told that some of our own damage and loss in the battle has not yet been reported.

But, all these wise cautions accepted, the fact of a great victory still remains, and it is a fitting thing to see where credit for the victory belongs. Obviously, it belongs to every thing American. One can start with the fleet commanders of the sea, men who have led the fleet, men who have engaged the enemy, men who have won the battle. More Preparation

But before that can happen, the corridor itself must be made thoroughly secure, and particularly secure from attack by the German forces still operating to the west of the corridor. To ease danger of attack from this quarter, and to give the Allies room to deploy and supply the coming attack into Germany, the British Second Army has now been engaged for five days in an operation aimed westward from the corridor in the general direction of the Dutch Channel coast.

New Haven, Oct. 27.—Common practices of gambling by inmates from whom guards took a percentage of the winnings, and the prevalent use of liquor "somewhat" by guards and prisoners were cited in the report of State Referee Carl Foster of Bridgeport, Conn., which was made available to one-man investigation into the affairs of the New Haven county jail.

In a 15-page report, released by Judge Frank P. McEvoy of the Superior court yesterday, Foster recommended that a charge of embezzlement be filed against a dismissed clerk of the institution, and that both High Sheriff Edward Slavin and Chief Deputy Jailer Nicholas W. Mena be removed from their posts in the administration of the jail's affairs.

Slavin, who originated the first offenders' club several years ago, was dismissed yesterday because of his failure to receive a copy of the Foster report. Therefore, he had no comment to make on it.

The report said that Louis J. Ferruti, dismissed clerk, had been absent about \$8,127 in his duties from May 1, 1943, but that he had made up the amount from funds he had received from gamblers and other persons. Ferruti was dismissed yesterday because he had failed when questioned by Slavin about the reasons for Ferruti's discharge "to disclose the true facts."
