Baldwin Favors Liberalization of Workmen's Compensation Act to Meet Living Jump.

Vice President Henry Wallace yesterday in a day-long tour of Connecticut's Fourth Congressional district, urged the election of Bridgport's Margaret E. Conners, Democrat, over Rep.
