Ottawa, Dec. 1.—(AP)—Canada's discipline was declared restored among rebellious drafted troops on the west coast and an appeal for help went out to the people of Quebec while freezing conditions extended toward the Gulf of Mexico.

Japs Suffer More Losses as Convoy Raided Off Leyte

Disastrous Attempts to Replenish Garrisons Have Cost 26,000 Troops Lost at Sea; 5,000 Drown in Latest Yankee Attack.

General MacArthur's Headquarters, Philippines, Dec. 1.—(AP)—Japan's disastrous attempts to replenish her garrisons in the Philippines cost her 26,000 troops lost at sea in the destruction of seven convoys, the latest one on Thursday with 5,000 men and uncounted supplies aboard.

Planned Sink Transport Gen. Douglas MacArthur announced today that low-flying American planes sank a 9,000-ton transport and three small freighters headed toward the west coast of Ormoc on Leyte. In addition, a 5,000-ton freighter and a destroyer were hit and left burning.

The transports were heavily loaded with men. General MacArthur said in a communique that the enemy's loss of life is estimated at 8,000 men.

It was the second convoy destroyed in two days. On Wednesday, 12 ships were sunk at two at the dock after unloading but the rest sank at sea with all hands aboard.

MacArthur said 29 transports totaling 107,700 tons and 13 escort ships have been sunk in the seven convoys knocked out.

Three Yank Armies Beat Out Advances; Patrols Cross Inside

Waves of Bombers Hit Reich in Night

Draw Up Solid Assault Lines Along Both Roer and Saar, Two Important Barriers to Rhine; Ninth Army Captures Wetz; Patton's Tanks Plunge Forward Half Mile.

London, Dec. 1.—(AP)—Four American armies threw the Germans back across the Roer and Saar rivers and forced the easternmost tip of France today, U. S. First Army troops struck for the remaining gaps of Nazi strength along the Roer.

Cologne plain as General Eisenhower daily increased the pressure on blinding enemy forces. Lt. Gen. Courtney H. Hodges' troops gained up to 400 yards in assaults directed at the Hurtgen forest hamlets of Geis and Brandenberg.

Paris, Dec. 1.—(AP)—Three American armies beat out hard-won gains across churning battlefields today and drew up solid assault lines along both the Roer and Saar, two of the most important barriers to the Rhine. Lt. Gen. William H. Simpson's Ninth Army captured Wetz, one mile south of Lintrich and drew a bullet wound in the eastern tip of the Rheinland city of Munchausen, a strategically important town.

Pressing Against Saar Lt. Gen. George B. Patton's Third Army pushed against the west bank of the Saar and the Rhine.

Prepare Plans to Open Private Airport Here

Local Resident Reveals Program That Is Approved by the Civil Aeronautics Authority.

A private airport will be opened in Manchester next April, it was revealed today, by William Holland, of 340 West Center street, with an unnamed group of business men backing the project. The informant revealed that he will operate the Manchester airport a night instructor and has already made arrangements to take on the agency for several makes of light planes. The airport will be opened commercially as a main airport and will construct one main hangar of modern design, three 2,700-foot runways and a private T-hangar or plane storage. A commercial repair shop will also be built.

Plans Are Approved Mr. Holland said that details of the Manchester airport are still on the drawing board but have been acceptable to the Civil Aeronautics Administration. Several sites have been inspected by his committee, Mr. Holland stated, but definite action has not been taken regarding acquisition of any particular site. The new private airport will be named the Manchester Memorial Airport in honor of the service men of Manchester.

While the airport will be opened as a commercial field and under a Class I listing, it is the plan of the projectors to improve the airport so that a classification of Class 2 may be obtained through the CAA, Mr. Holland stated.

Object of the Enterprise The principal objective of the Manchester Memorial Airport is to make private flying as inexpensive to private flyers as possible. Hitherto, private airports charged unreasonable rates for private flying instruction and storage and repair rates were far beyond the limits for this type of recreation, he said. The group of local men interested in the airport plan will soon make a definite decision regarding the approval of one of the several sites now under option to them, and the announcement of their selection will be made in this newspaper. The type of field to be laid out at the start will be a field with the three 2,700-foot runways laid down according to the prevailing wind directions at that location.

Detail Locates Body of Flier

Found in Dense Swamp About Two Miles from Putnam Crash Scene.

Putnam, Dec. 1.—(AP)—A search detail from Bradley Field, led by Maj. John Mitchell last night recovered the body of the pilot of the Army fighter plane which crashed here Wednesday. The dead pilot identified by Hills Grove, R.I., air base officials as First Lieut. Robert W. Anderson, was found in a dense swamp on the Appleby farm about two miles from the scene of the crash.

State and local police and citizens searched all day yesterday under the direction of Air Corps officials from Hills Grove and Bradley air fields. It was believed that the pilot might have parachuted to safety as his chute was missing from the plane when it was recovered by a steam shovel.

More Rooms Loom For Transients Washington, Dec. 1.—(AP)—The OPA moved today to make additional rooms available to transient guests.

I authorized more operators of hotels and rooming houses to petition for removal of a requirement that they continue to offer for weekly or monthly occupancy the same number of rooms on this basis that they did in June 1942.

Under the new regulation, landlords with up to 50 per cent of their rooms occupied on a weekly or monthly basis may petition to offer additional rooms as transient basis.

In cases where this permission is granted, landlords must charge a weekly rate to tenants in occupancy more than 10 days. OPA said.

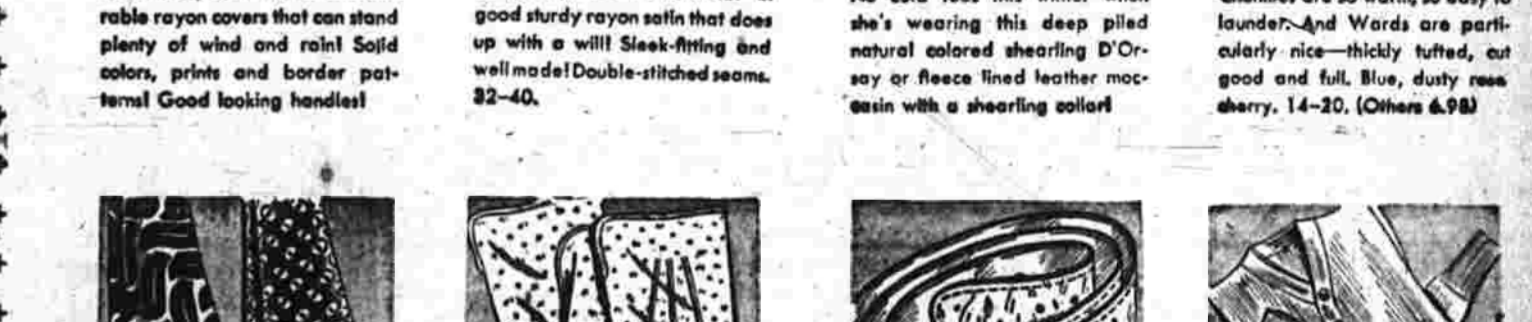
