A 57-mile wind caused damage to signs and building cornices in New York City. Thousands of commuters were delayed yesterday when high tides stalled railroad and ferry traffic on Long Island and in New Jersey. Power and communication lines, as well as traffic, were disrupted in upstate sections. Many New England communities were without power and tele-

The tide rose 13.8 feet in Boston, equal to the second highest tide ever recorded. Winds and rough water damaged fishing boats and equipment in a number of harbors. In eastern Canada, high anow drifts resulted in three traffic deaths and many injuries, and a tie-up of transportation and communications.

About 20 roofs were lifted by high-velocity winds in Quebec city where telegraph and telephone lines were broken by the wind and weight of the snow. Several sec-tions of Montreal were without electricity when power lines snap-
