to such a threat. Obviously, it alone would not be enough. If we were going to try to make ourselves thoroughly safe from such an attack, we would have to attempt many other things as well. We would have to have anti-aircraft guns always in position, in the hope that they might be able to stop the attack. We would have to have the world's greatest navy always on patrol, in the hope that it could detect or intercept attack. We would have to maintain such vigilance as to make sure that the next attack would most efficiently come from some nation which was presumably our friend. And we would have to keep an attack of our own always poised to strike back at the aggressor's homeland. We would, in other words, have to be going through the motions of fighting a war—if we hoped, that is, to be able to repel and answer an attack such as that described.

Universal military service would only be a small and relatively economical beginning to such a state of preparedness. If we return ourselves to living in the kind of world where such an attack must be expected, it is even worse than that. The most dreadful possibility of all is the possibility that all such measures would prove to be vain, that all hopes of defense would be futile and false. Across the Saar

The achievement of General Patton's men in sweeping through Saarland and effecting the surprise capture of a bridge the Germans had mined and failed to demolish is one of those dramatic facts which brightens the day's news and makes the western offensive seem, for a moment, less than the terrible struggle it is and will apparently continue to be, for some time.

The American First Army's crossing of the Rhine and the American Ninth's march on to the West Wall, a development which symbolizes territorial advance, which is the easiest thing about this fighting front to understand. Such developments make it seem, to the home front, that we are getting somewhere.

But just where did General Patton's men get themselves by their brilliant crossing of the Saar River? They got themselves across a barrier the Germans might have made formidable, that is true. But where are they now? The answer is that they are now in positions to attack the most formidable section of the Siegfried Line, where that line curves past the Rhine in order to protect the mines and other resources of the Saar. We have, as yet, breached the Siegfried Line at only one point, at Aachen, and even the home front has been demanding of what a bloody struggle that was.

So what General Patton's men have won, after their glorious conquest of impregnable Metz, after their brilliant sweep across the Saar, in the privilege of the toughest battle they have yet had to fight, the German High Command, in its defense plans, is relying upon the Siegfried Line to serve its purpose in this area. It thinks this line is good enough to keep General Patton busy for the rest of the war. It is fighting its battle to keep the line at the entrance to the Cologne plain, and it thinks General Patton can be prevented from determining any vital part in determining the fate of Germany.

For us to expect General Patton to surprise them is to ask the impossible. That does not mean he won't be able to do it. It does describe, accurately, the situation his men face.
