Nazis Admit Loss Of Town of Vac; Also Lose Aszod

Assert Fresh Russian Reinforcements Put Into Battle for Budapest; No Attempt to Cross Danube as Soviet Units Turn South.

London, Dec. 9.—(AP)—The Berlin radio said today the Germans have lost the town of Vac 15 miles northeast of Budapest on the Danube, after hard fighting. Asserting the Russians had thrown in fresh reinforcements in the battle for Budapest, Transceca said German lines had to be taken back several miles east of the capital.

Soviets Increase Pressure On Budapest

From their penetration north of Budapest, the news agency said, "The Soviets increased their pressure southwards on Budapest at the same time attacking toward the north."

Previously Berlin Had Announced That the Russians Attaching Westward from Captured Hatvan Had Captured the Railroad Town of Aszod, 15 Miles Northeast of Budapest, and Were Threatening Vac.

Capture of Vac would seal off Budapest from the big bend of the Danube where the river turns west toward Vienna.

The Hard-driving Russian Armies were closing on Budapest like a vise amid Moscow reports of wholesale defections by Hungarians from the defending forces.

The city already was under heavy pressure from Russian forces on the west bank of the Danube less than 13 miles south of the city.

Berlin also said units of the Second and Third Ukrainian Armies had linked up on the west bank of the Danube at Erst, 12 miles south of Budapest following a crossing by Malinovsky's troops from Csepel, the narrow island that splits the Danube for 30 miles south of the capital.

A supplementary communique stressed that Hungarian units fighting with the Nazi defenders of Budapest and western Hungary were giving up in great numbers in the face of their commanders acknowledged was hopeless.

A midnight Soviet bulletin said an entire Hungarian infantry regiment comprising 35 officers and 1,300 men surrendered as a unit in the Danube front. The bulletin said 1,600 Germans and Hungarians were killed yesterday on the front west of the Danube.
