Peace Is Key To Abundance

Senators Convinced Cigarettes Will Be Short Until War Is Won

Washington, Dec. 15.—(AP)—Senate investigators are about convinced today that the only way to end the cigarette shortage is by winning the war.

As long as the war lasts, Senator Ferguson (R-Mich.) summed up, there is little that can be done to bolster civilian stocks, and the crisis will become more acute.

"It looks as though the smokers will have to hurry, victor along by putting their money behind the soldiers and sailors through bond purchases," he told a reporter.

Rest From Labor

Ferguson, Chairman Mead (D-N.Y.) and other members of the War Investigating committee who conducted two days of hearings to determine the cause of it all, and the solution, if any, rested from their labors today.

Their next step, said Mead, is "to digest the testimony."

Insists Court Has All Facts

Justice Department Sees No Need to Send AP Suit to Lower Court

Washington, Dec. 15.—(AP)—The Justice Department insists the Supreme court now has all the essential facts in it to decide the government's civil anti-trust suit against The Associated Press.

"The department is in a memorandum presented to the tribunal yesterday argued that there is no need to send the case back to a lower court for a trial in which evidence would be produced through testimony of witnesses and cross-examination of them."

Requested by Court

The memorandum was requested by the Supreme court, which took the case under advisement after hearing argument last week.

During the argument, several questions were asked, and the counsel closely on the reasons for the action of the lower court in deciding the AP case by summary judgment—judgment based solely on affidavits and depositions.
