prolonged came from Samuel W. Anderson, vice chairman of the W.P.B.

"The present military situation in Europe will come back and hit us between the eyes in various ways, at present 'unknown,' he told a news conference.

"The purpose of the freeze is to see that rising civilian production does not interfere with urgent munitions output," he added. "I haven't any idea how long it will last, or how long we will have critical shortages in war materials."

**History May Repeat**  
Secretary of War Stimson saw a chance that history may repeat itself and that this big German offensive might be like those which

fell short in 1918, to be followed by early Allied victory.

If this big drive can be smashed, Stimson said, it is possible that the war may be "definitely shortened."

As Stimson spoke, Paris dispatches told of the Germans rolling through Belgium and also across Luxembourg. The advance had been halted on the banks in Luxembourg on the south and in the Malmedy-Stavelot sector on the north.

Representative Brooks (D-La.), back from a European tour, expressed the opinion that it supplies had kept up with them, American troops might now be in Berlin.

**Germany Allowed Time**  
He said a lack of munitions in Allied hands at the front had allowed the Germans time to build up for their present push.

Another member of the congressional party which toured the battlefield, Representative Shaffer (R-Mich.), brought back a picture of shortages of trucks, tires, supplies and news. "Ammunition is being rationed to so many roads as a day on the western and Italian fronts," Shaffer said.

Krug said "very favorable prospects" are being made on big guns and shells and heavy trucks and tires. He did not see plans for expanding tire production still more and for boosting the output of "cock duck for tents."

capital and on the fortress city of Sekestseber.

The Germans also confess nervousness over Red Army attacks in the vicinity of the great bend in the Danube northwest of Budapest, where the river veers westward.

(Berlin announced yesterday that 100,000 Soviet troops had broken out gains on a 40-mile front southwest of Budapest in new offensive aimed at taking the Hungarian capital from the east and opening the most direct invasion route to Vienna. The Nazi said Sekestseber already was menaced.)

**Capture 50 Localities**  
In northern Hungary, other units of Red Army troops captured 50 localities on a winding 200-mile front southeast of Looson and toward Budapest.

They freed a railway spur of the Mikolo-Looson line and seized part of another spur jutting southwest from Barabon on the Slovak border, substantially narrowing the German escape route from the Hungary-Slovak frontier area.

Molotov's troops took 149 more German and Hungarian prisoners of war, making an announced total of 42,734 in the last 42 days.

**Berlin Reports Russian Attack in Latvia**  
London, Dec. 22.—(AP)—The Berlin radio said today the Russians in a new attack in the long-dormant northern sector, had burst through the German escape route on a 22-mile front south of the Latvian town of Saldus (Braunburg), about 60 miles southwest of Riga and approximately the same distance from the Baltic coast.

Assault divisions supported by tank formations and preceded by a terrific artillery bombardment of approximately 170,000 shells in 80 minutes opened the attack.

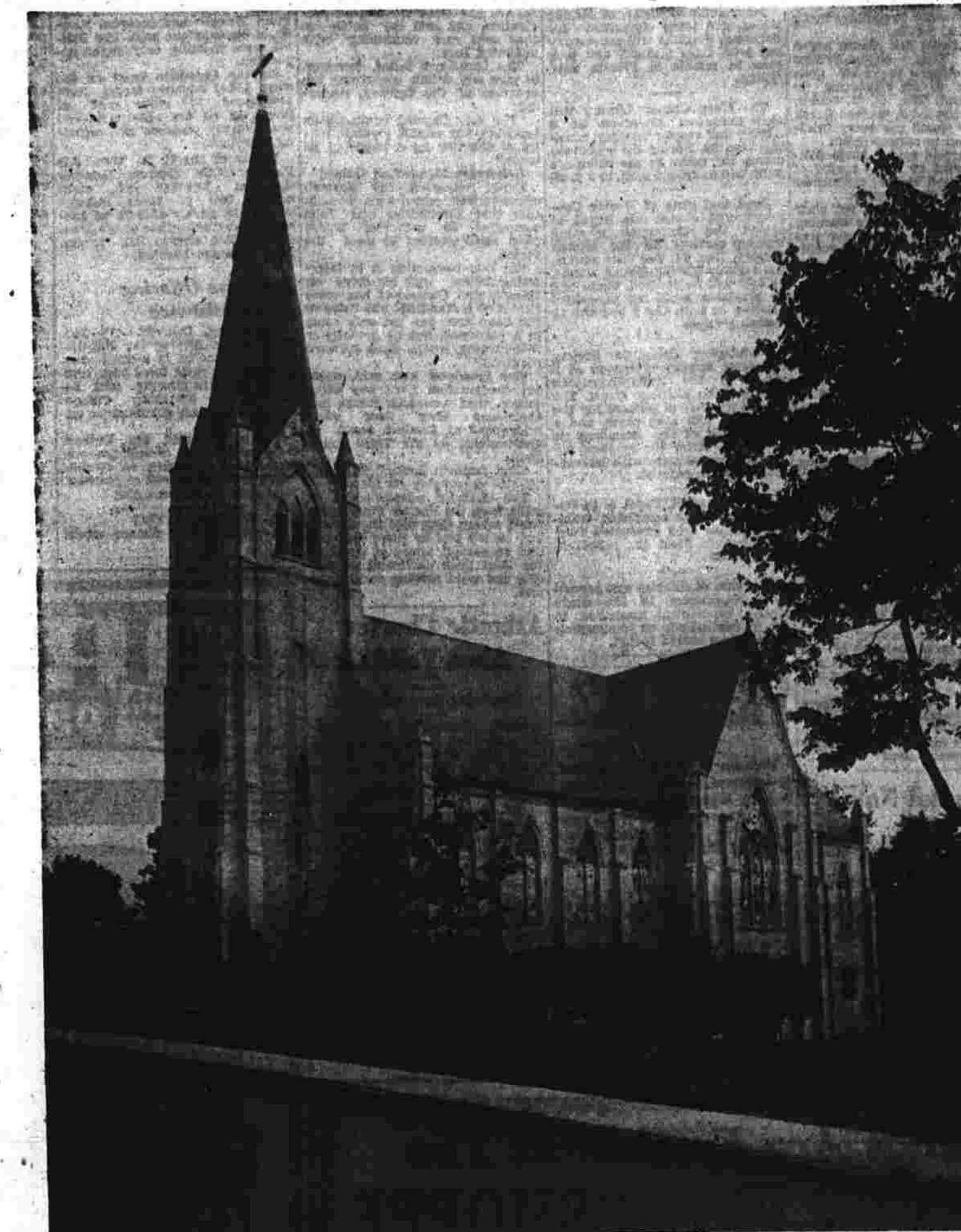
