6 ways to protect your eyesight
1. Don't sit in direct glare. Shade eyes with light to eliminate glare and use indirect lighting reflected light on your shiny surfaces. A highly polished table should be covered if you are to work or read at it for long lengths of time.
2. Avoid reflected glare. Guard against light reflected into the eyes from shiny surfaces. A highly polished table should be covered if you are to work or read at it for long lengths of time.
3. Don't sit in your own shadow. Reading or working in your own shadow can cause severe eyestrain. Your shadow can be covered if you are to work or read at it for long lengths of time.
4. Rest your eyes occasionally. Your eyes work four or five times on every line of type. To read an average article requires about 40,000 muscular movements. So stop and rest awhile.
5. Keep bulbs clean. Remove your bulbs and burn occasionally to give them a bath in warm, soapy water. The brighter they are the brighter your light. Dirty bulbs can mean 5% to 20% less light.
6. Use right bulbs. Floor lamps should have 150 watt; table lamps, 100 to 150 watt; reflector lamps, 300 watt; 2-foot lamps, 60 to 75 watts; 3-foot lamps, 40 to 60 watts; kitchen, 150 watts.

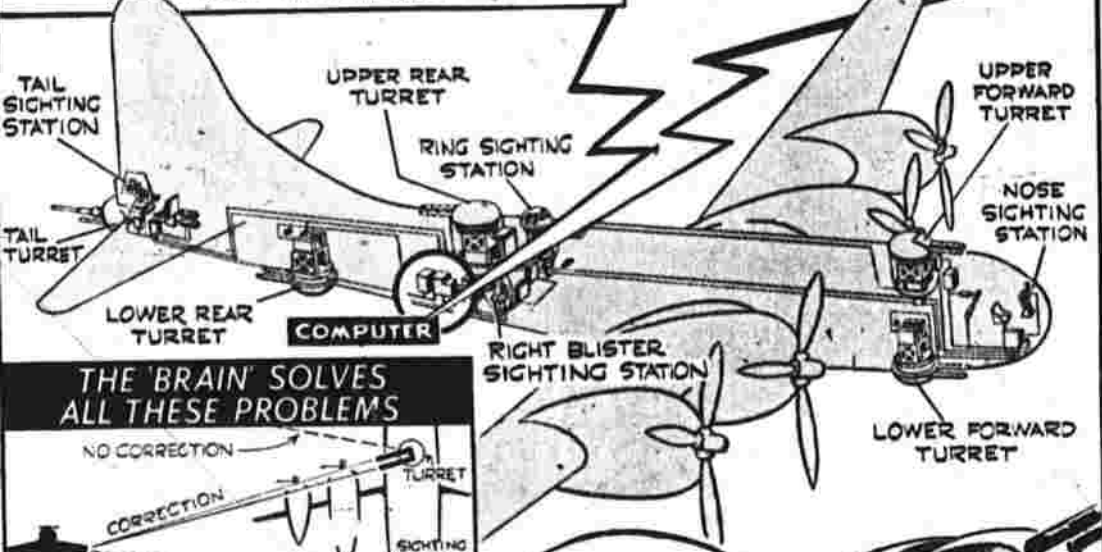
