



> For even when the war in Europe comes to an end, it does not mean that what's left in the Pacific is merely routine clean-up.

The plain truth of the matter is that welhave not yet begun to wage full-sized war in the East. And neither has the Jap.

Furthermore, it will be bigger, tougher, and longer than most Americans now expect.

In the interests of fighting the most quickly decisive war, let no American fool himself on three counts-the length of the war, the strength and endurance of the enemy, and the cost of the war.

If he has any doubts, let him examine the facts:

THE LENGTH OF THE WAR

The Allied Military Command has estimated that it will take years, not months, to lick Japan.

One and a half to two years after the defeat of Germany is regarded as the absolute minimum. To bank on any less time would be sheer folly.



















