But we Americans are finding hard to recommend that the General Motors strike be settled on a basis of nineteen and a half cents an hour, the union announced that it would accept that increase as basis for settlement of its new contract with Ford.

Ford, in turn, has now offered to grant a wage increase of seven and a half cents an hour.

The sum dividing the two parties to the future contract is, therefore, sixteen cents an hour, eight cents a 40 hour week.

Most of us could settle this atomic bomb, one question is whether to let us trust our allies to prepare a goal of peace, or to prepare for war against those allies.

But making the right decision, if we are able to make it, is probably going to be even more difficult than in the case of the atomic bomb.

The bomb, at least as we know it, does not require the assistance of Congress. But their cry for bases will not so easily quell our own military leadership.

They are to fight openly for bases, where it did not quite dare to fight openly for monopoly of the bomb.

But that we should renounce Congress, the right decision, if we are able to make it, is probably going to be even more difficult than in the case of the atomic bomb.

Nuernberg, Jan. 16.—(AP)—The Army newspaper Stars and Stripes reported today that Army investigators had struck a "hot trail" that might lead to the arrest of an American officer in the cremation slaying of three Military Government officers at Passau ten days ago.

The paper said it had learned that one of the victims, First Lieutenant Stanley H. Rowenator of Omaha, Neb., apparently was still alive and in Passau, but it was not clear whether he had been rescued or was being held there.

**January Is Most Popular Month for Weddings Here**

The report of the vital statistics of the town for the year 1945 submitted by Town Clerk Samuel J. Purdington, shows 322 births, 266 marriages and 212 deaths.

The month of January, 1946, with 35 births, was the high month of the year, exceeding by one the months of July and August, when 34 births were reported in each.

January proved the most popular month of 1945 for marriages, exceeding the traditional bridal month of June by four marriages, 32 to 28. Even the largest number of marriages in 1945, 40, was reported in December.

In death, the largest number was reported in October when 261 deaths were reported. The lowest month of the year for deaths was June, when but 12 were reported, with November second lowest with 15 deaths.

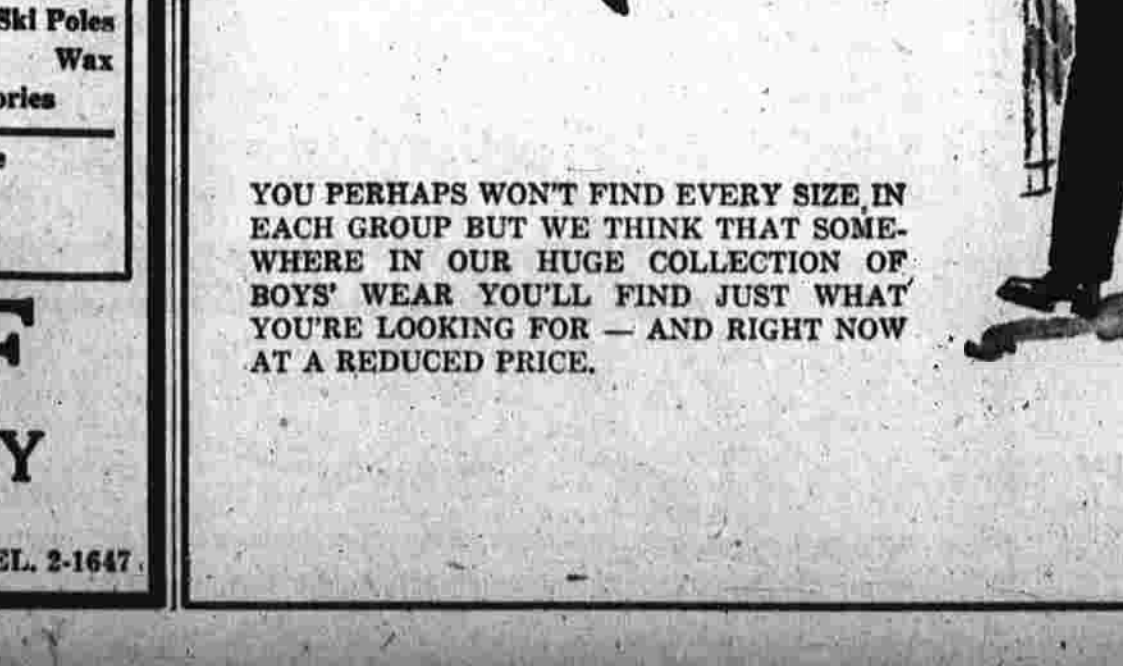
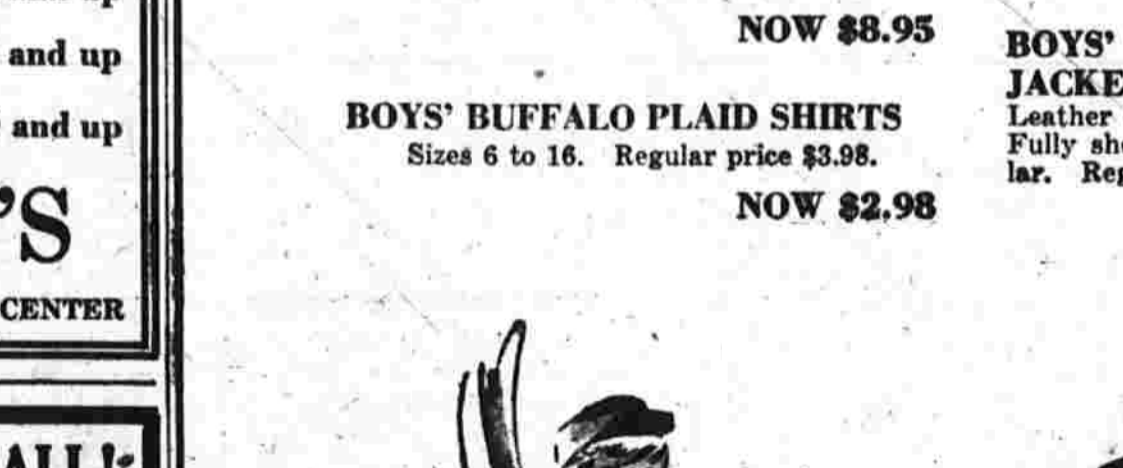
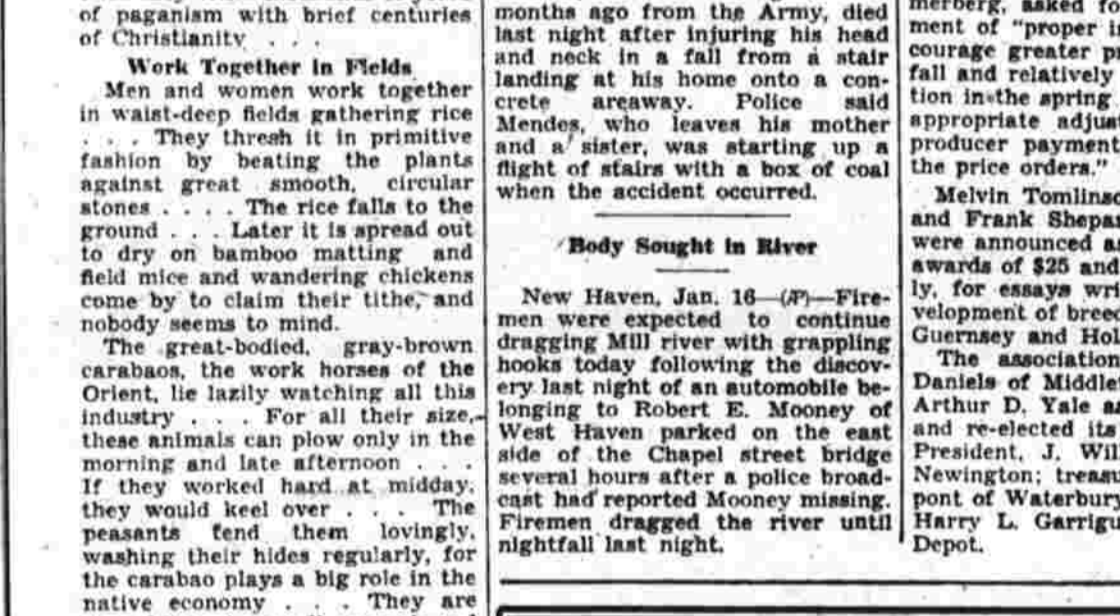
