Higher Milk Prices Loom

Series of Meetings Is Scheduled to Consider Raising of Prices

Washington, Jan. 17.—(AP)—The government is scheduling a series of meetings which may result eventually in higher milk prices. These increases possibly would be made during the spring and summer and three cents a quart during winter months.

The first of hearings will open at New York tomorrow. The second will be held for the Boston milk market next month. Similar sessions are planned in most large cities where dairymen's prices are regulated by the Agriculture department under Federal milk marketing orders.
