Five Top Powers Reach No Accord On UNO Position

Fail Again to Agree on Candidate for Secretary-General After Secret Meeting in Office of Byrnes; Drift Toward Deadlock Fear

London, Jan. 21. (AP)—The top men of the five principal powers in the United Nations met secretly in the office of Secretary of State James F. Byrnes today and were reported to have failed again to agree on a candidate for secretary-general of the United Nations organization.

The negative result of the government officials' meeting was to express fear that the five powers were drifting toward a deadlock on the question, which is acute because of political interference made by Iran against Byrnes in Greece and Indonesia.

Byrnes' official spokesman today said the five-power meeting and a later meeting of representatives of all 11 United Nations members will be held in London on Friday, Feb. 8 at 8 p. m., at which time members will have an opportunity to get acquainted.

Washington, Jan. 21.—(AP)—Congress heard from its own ranks today how it should streamline itself, and the program includes pay raises, pensions and extra assistants.

By a parliamentary viewpoint, most of the recommendations that Congress break the tight control which the House rules committee now can exercise over pending legislation.

Extensive Study Made The program for moderating the nation's top-law-making machinery was reported by a Senate "House subcommittee" which has been making an extensive study of congressional reorganization.
