From his cell in Stanley prison, Chester Bennett saw the morning of Oct. 28, 1943, dawn clear and beautiful. It was his last half-day on earth.

In a few hours this American "hero of Hong Kong" and 32 other prisoners were to be put to death on charges of espionage and "conspiring against the imperial Japanese non-community down the double line, lopping of heads with powerful strokes and they never no outcries. In a few seconds it was all over. Word of their rate had filtered through to some 3,000 internees in Stanley camp. They felt particularly sorry for the cheerful, big shouldered American who had sunggled money in to them so that they could buy food.
