Britain May Face Bread Rationing

London, Feb. 6.—Britain may be forced to ration bread—a measure avoided even in the darkest days of the war—unless wheat consumption is greatly decreased, says Food Minister Sir Ben Smith. Mr. Smith said that the government is now studying the possibility of a world wheat shortage. He took to the radio to urge the people to "save every scrap of bread" and Agriculture Minister Tom Williams called on all Britons to spade up their backyards again and plant gardens to help feed themselves.

Rockville S. N. Bartlett Passes Away

Rockville Resident Noted for Wonderful Flower Gardens

Rockville, Feb. 6.—(Special) Sherman Nye, Bartlett of 3 Prospect street, died at the Francis Convalescent Hospital in West Hartford on Tuesday.

He was a former printer and knew in Rockville for his garden which he made his hobby at the rear of his home. Many visitors were attracted to this garden where he had many unusual flowers in a unique arrangement of plants.

He was born in Chesterfield, N. H., September 6, 1869, the son of Samuel Plimney and Ella Frances Bartlett. He was employed by the Hartford City Directory until 1905 and then worked at various printing shops of the Hartford Times and in 1916 moved to Rockville and became associated with the Rockville Leader, retiring in 1934.
