May Use Cheney Home As Temporary Hospital

Residence of the Late Annie and Louise Cheney Being Considered; Can Accommodate 35

The possibility of using the residence of the late Annie and Louise Cheney at 50 Hartford street as a temporary hospital is being considered by the trustees of the Manchester Memorial hospital. The premises have not been occupied since the death of Mrs. Cheney on May 25, 1944. The largest and most pretentious residential property in Manchester is estimated that it would accommodate at least 35 patients. The Memorial hospital is overcrowded at present and there is a constantly increasing demand for the output of shirts, shorts, pajamas, work clothing and other scarce garments.

Will Be In Two Parts The price increase for cotton fabrics will be in two parts: a general increase of about three and one-half cents a pound in recognition of higher market prices for raw cotton and to offset recent wage increases. Mills which did not raise wages will get only one cent of this.

As an additional incentive increase of five per cent to apply on selected fabrics already needed for the war effort.

While the agencies sponsoring the program were unable to estimate the agencies' cost, they said adjustments in retail prices, they said present clothing on shelves, for example, might be hiked about five or six cents.
