### Local Schools Keep Up Work

#### Pupils Continue to Buy Stamps and Bonds; Records Are Cited

Students in Manchester's public schools are continuing to buy government stamps and bonds through their weekly school sales plan. The Connecticut Schools-A-War program, so ably established and administered by Mrs. Raymond E. Baldwin during the war years, has carried over into the peace days its excellent record of encouraging the savings of young people in our schools.

Although it is true that the acute need for this type of support to meet our national government's immense war time expenditures has decreased since V-J Day, Manchester's youth still benefit by its desire to serve its country through the purchase of stamps and bonds. It is a fact that it can carry through, to the end of this fiscal year, a record of participation in a national effort of this kind.

Look For Citation  
Miss Esther Granstrom, principal of the Manchester Green school, states, "Our aim is to win the 'We Financed the War' award for participation during the current year, the same high school throughout the war, to try their Minute-Man program."

Whereas the sale of "war" stamps and bonds was stimulated by the fact that the school's name was placed on field equipment in active service, the Nathan Hale school's two field ambulances at \$200 each, and one jeep at \$120, of last spring's campaign, the goal this year has been to purchase a new field ambulance at \$200 each.

Highland Park school, with its excellent monthly participation of over 95% all this year, together with Robertson school, which provided one unit for the Framingham Veterans Hospital, each school received a commendation of the decalomania which has been placed on a veteran's bed in the hospital.

Another splendid record for the year has been compiled by the pupils of the Green and Lincoln schools, both of which have maintained 90 per cent student participation in monthly sales, and the attainment of their joint goal of \$10, while those living in the homes of non-relatives will receive \$12 weekly.

The fund, administered by Capt. W. A. Armstrong, provided a total of \$25,000 in Liberty bonds, the base value of the fund was increased to \$15,000,000 in 1945. A contract embodying the 10 per cent boost has been accepted by employees of two other divisions—Chance Vought and Sikorsky—and the union local at the Pratt and Whitney Aircraft division will consider it at a meeting Sunday.
