Bakery Gives Up War Substitutes

The Manchester Baking Company, 75 Kerry street, has adopted a new policy which should be of benefit to its customers. It has announced that it will give up all its war substitutes favor filling its pastries in favor of the extra cream. Due to the extreme shortage of cream it was necessary to use such substitutes as margarine in such delicacies as cream puffs, gingerbread, scones, angel food and cheese cake. However, the company now feels that it is able to get heavy cream in enough quantity to warrant no more of these substitutes.
