Washington, March 21.—(AP)—Former Secretary of War Henry L. Stimson has disclosed that President Roosevelt's "war cabinet" discussed and rejected nine days before Pearl Harbor an attack on Japanese forces.

Stimson related that on the morning of Friday, Nov. 28, 1941, he received information from Japanese movements along the coast. The Japanese were "a formidable character" that he went to the White House.

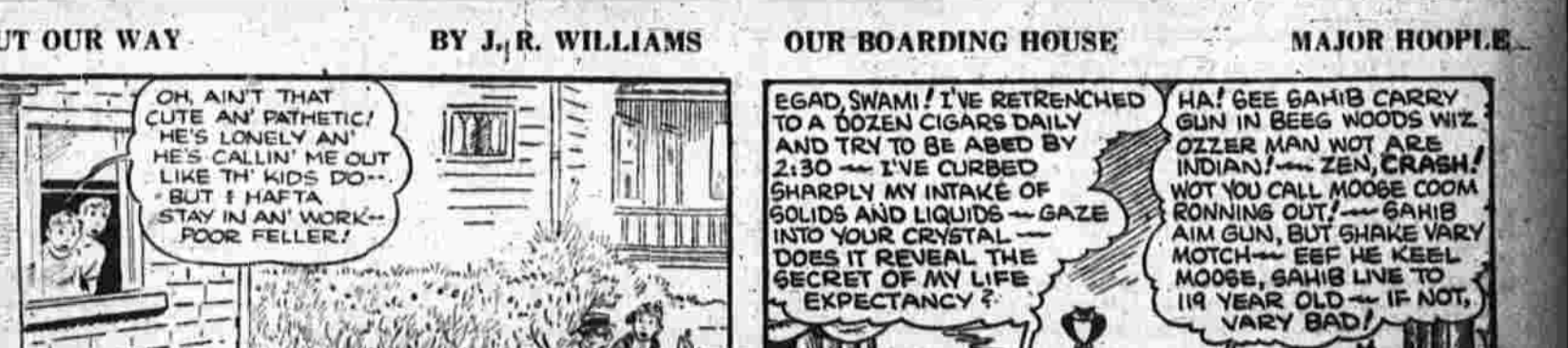
