Neither Russia Nor Iran Has Sent Reply To Request for Complete Information on Difficulties Between Nations; Deadline in 24 Hours

New York, April 2.—(AP)—Neither Russia nor Iran had filed replies this morning to the United Nations Security Council's request for complete information on the current difficulties between the two countries. With the deadline only 24 hours away it was still uncertain whether the Russian Republic or Iran would send a reply to the Council's question.

A dispatch from Tehran, capital of Iran, reported that the Iranian government had received the Council's question. It is understood that the Iranian government will file its reply by noon today.

The Russian Republic's failure to reply is also noted. The Russian Republic's foreign minister, Vyacheslav Molotov, is reported to be in Moscow.

The Council's question was filed on April 1. It asks for information on the difficulties between Iran and the Russian Republic, and for a statement of the steps taken to resolve the difficulties.

Only, of course, he doesn't want the public to blame it on him. When the public clamors or rises, it will be the mine owners and the government who are supposed to be the allies of the strike. Lewis has price for resuming production.

Can The Atom Equal This?

It is a strange relief, this morning, to contemplate, from a safe distance, of course, a catastrophe which can be classified as an act of God, or as a voluntary act of old mother earth in giving vent to her inner turmoil. Man has through a great period of causing his own catastrophes. He has recently discovered the scientific means of producing nuclear catastrophes so great that whether only nature could possibly produce them. For the future, he is determined upon playing with his own catastrophic toys, to see how close he can get to coming to a certain point of no return, which really expect to happen. But, as in the General Motors strike, each side considers it important to hold a fixed position for a certain length of time. While they are doing this, both sides suffer and the nation suffers. This is not collective bargaining, as most people visualize collective bargaining. It is collective blackmail. In every such collective blackmail, the participants seem able to arrive at a reasonable solution only after they have spent an unreasonable time in this blackmail of each other. This is not the American people. Unless we win, they say to each other and to the American people, you must suffer. And everybody does suffer, all for the attainment of a result which any neutral observer might predict in the first place, before the strike even begins.
