Would Rescind Vote Taken on March 1 Give a \$35,000 Bonus

The Selectmen last night voted to schedule a special town meeting for Friday evening, March 12, for the purpose of rescinding the vote taken at the March 1 meeting which in effect empowered the Selectmen to apportion the sum of \$35,000 as a "bonus" instead of a "wage adjustment" which was intended in the original motion.

According to an opinion given by the Selectmen by Town Council Judge William S. Hyde, the vote on the amendment to the original motion made by Chairman Chambers of the Board of Selectmen, changed the entire character of the plan from a "wage adjustment" to that of a "bonus" leaving open to the employees of the town the right to date entitled to share in the division of the \$35,000 bonus, regardless of length of service.

Why Not Win in 1948?
The Hartford Courant comments upon the defeat of former Senator John A. Danaher at Washington Monday in the following words:

"Connecticut Republicans, with the exception of a few dissenters who convinced themselves by some quirk of logic that former-Senator John A. Danaher was a dangerous isolationist, will regret that the Republican National Committee did not elect Mr. Danaher to its chairmanship in yesterday's hotly-contested race."

This sort of thing might, of course, degenerate into an argument over who is most qualified to interpret the sentiment of Connecticut Republicans in 1944. Fortunately, no such argument is necessary. Connecticut Republicans undertook, in the 1944 election, to speak for themselves. And in that election Governor Raymond E. Baldwin, a Republican, did almost 70,000 votes better than his running mate, Mr. Danaher. Does the Courant pretend that Governor Baldwin received Democratic votes? Or does it admit the truth, which is that many thousands of Republican voters, not just a few dissenters, considered the special defeat of Mr. Danaher an essential part of the welfare of the party, state and nation?

Just as the Courant views the election of Congressman B. Carroll Reese as an acceptable substitute for Mr. Danaher, so, for exactly the same reason, one must judge, we regard the substitution of Mr. Reese for Mr. Danaher as little more than a negative victory. For Mr. Reese likewise is an isolationist. Accounts of the National Committee session report plainly enough that there was no issue on policy between the Danaher and Reese camps. The difference was that one was devoted to the presidential aspirations of Governor Dewey and that the other was prepared to favor presidential nomination which would be approved by Senator Robert Taft.

In other words, it was a friendly rivalry between two temporarily divided segments of the one general faction which has done so much to lose elections for the Republican party in the past. Throughout the proceedings, that liberal and progressive element of the party which descends from Wendell Willkie, and which alone has a chance of preparing the party for its deserved victory in 1948, was in a minority, so far as the Republican National Committee was concerned. That is no new situation, so far as the party organization is concerned. Before he became a candidate for national chairman, Mr. Danaher's preference was a \$20,000 a year expert in the employ of the national committee showed that body had in itself no disposition to learn the reason of its frequent defeats, but was instead determined upon the perpetuation of lame duck principles and all this may be eminently satisfactory to the Courant, and we judge that it is. But there are some Republicans for whom the Courant does not speak.
