2,000 Claims Not Allowed

No Evidence Claimants Seeking Work Since Being Laid Off in 1945

Hartford, April 18.—State Labor Commissioner John J. Egan said today that he had allowed 2,000 "unjustifiable" claims for unemployment compensation benefits "where no evidence appeared of any action on the part of the claimant to seek work."

Egan said that a check of 4,192 cases "indicates... that 477 per cent of the claimants were laid off last August or September, drew all the unemployment compensation benefits to which they were entitled, and have not been near the U. S. Employment Service since any effort whatever to find a job."

"Similar facts," said Egan, "have generally been held by appeals commissioners and the courts to make claimants ineligible for benefits."

Not in Labor Market Now
Egan said he has concluded "that these facts show that such persons are not bona fide members of the labor market now. It seems to me entirely reasonable that such persons should be required to make an effort to find a job."

Boyle's COLUMN

By Richard Cushing (For Hal Boyle)

Shanghai, April 18.—The delicately-constructed peace engineered by General Marshall in his first three months in China crumbled at its foundations during his absence of less than five weeks.

It is generally believed here that he took all his diplomacy and prestige to again prop up China's wobbling internal structure.

When the special U. S. envoy left for Washington March 11, that structure looked fairly solid. Marshall had brought Generalissimo Chiang Kai-Shek's Kuomintang and the Chinese Communists together for a truce. It had been agreed to bring Communist divisions into a National Army of 60 divisions, one-fifth its war-time size.

Only a few hours before he left, a Kuomintang Communist truce committee agreed to end its trouble-shooting teams into Manchuria. It seemed likely a coalition government would be formed while he was away.

Situation Deteriorated
After he left, however, the situation in Manchuria deteriorated to open conflict, suspicions sprouted on both sides and the whole structure of unity was shaken.

Marshall, who carries more prestige in China than probably any other foreigner ever enjoyed, now faces a problem as tough as the one he tackled when he came to China last Christmas at President Truman's request.

Both the Kuomintang and the Communists have praised his work, and not only three months ago, but also in the past few days. He is now being accused of bias, but observers are wondering how long he can walk the middle path.

Marshall's first task will be to stop the fighting in Manchuria, which undoubtedly prompted his unexpectedly quick return to China.

His second task will be to persuade the Kuomintang and the Communists to live up to the political agreements they already have made.

Charge Agreements Violated
Government officials here are charging that the Communists are including other parties besides the now-ruling Kuomintang as planned at January's unity conference, as checked because the Communists accused the Kuomintang of violating the conference agreements.

Court Studies Job Contest

Bailey-Ryan Controversy Decision Not Expected for Weeks

Hartford, April 18.—The State Supreme court today was studying two opposing interpretations of a state statute concerning appointments, but was not expected to decide until several weeks have elapsed whether John M. Bailey or Elmer W. Ryan is the state's lawful statute revision commissioner.

Arguments replete with legal technicalities were advanced before the five Supreme court justices yesterday to prove that:

(1) John M. Bailey, Hartford Democrat named statute revision commissioner in 1941 by the then governor, Robert A. Hurley, continues to hold the \$7,000 a year post because the Senate adjourned last year without confirming Governor Baldwin's nomination of his successor, or that.

(2) Bailey's term expired July 1, 1945, thereby creating a vacancy, and the rightful holder of the office is Elmer W. Ryan, New Haven Republican and Assistant Clerk of the House when the governor named an interim appointee to fill the "vacancy" created when Bailey's four-year term ended.

Samuel Reich of Bridgeport and Adrian W. Maher, Democratic state chairman until he was named Federal prosecutor for Connecticut recently, argued for interpretation No. 1; State Attorney General William L. Hadden and his assistant, Bernard A. Kosek, argued just as vehemently for position No. 2.

The case is similar in some aspects to the recent controversy over the motor vehicles commission, a \$9,000 a year job which Governor Baldwin named.
