10-Year Term Given as May Pleads Guilty

Sentenced for Violating British Official Secrets Act by Disclosing Information

London, May 1.—(AP)—Dr. Alan Nunn May was sentenced today to 10 years in prison for violating the British official secrets act by disclosing restricted information, which his attorney said went to Soviet Russia, and concerned atomic energy.

He pleaded guilty. The 34-year-old May, who was arrested last March, was specifically charged with disclosing information to some person unknown certain information calculated to be, or which might be directly or indirectly, useful to an enemy.

The "enemy" was not specified, the prosecution declaring merely that it might be "any potential chairman of the Arab Higher Committee, said adoption of the report, which recommended that 100,000 European Jews be admitted immediately to Palestine."

Next of Kin Notified The Arab office said in a statement that the report, issued last night in London and Washington, must be resisted by the unanimous endeavor of the Arab and Muslim worlds.



Members of the Paper Salvage committee met at the hospital last evening and were guests at dinner of Superintendent William Boyer, who is a member of the committee.

At the business meeting which followed, it was reported by Chairman Raymond Cooper that there is a bank balance of \$1,698.21 at present and that committee equipment which Superintendent Slover has on order amounting to \$1,000.00 includes \$1,500 for basinettes, \$110 for ten steel lockers and \$235 for linen carts. Present income will adequately take care of all present commitments by the time the hospital is in the bank.

To date, the Paper Salvage committee has provided the hospital with \$7,419 worth of equipment which has been paid for out of the hospital to date of \$2,924.

More Hospital Beds

It was noted by the committee to accept Mr. Slover's recommendation that he place an additional 10 more modern full size hospital beds at a total cost of \$467. This expenditure, like all others made by the committee, has been done by a conservative banking plan which is reasonably certain that funds will be on hand to cover the order when it comes in. Some thought also given to the eventual remarking of four to five hundred dollars to furnish a new room in the proposed new wing.

Are Holding Up Wall

Chairman Cooper reported that totals for the various fund drives for holding up wall and hopes that people will continue their interest in paper salvage just as much in the months to come as they have in the past. For all of this money raised from paper salvage is doing a really worthwhile job for the hospital.

When it is considered that census figures show that the present of Manchester population passed in and out of the hospital for one reason or another during a year, there is all the more reason for the continued active support of paper salvage.

Many examples of the service of this new equipment could be pointed out and one well illustrated is that of the infant son of one of Manchester's known families who was saved because the hospital had a modern baby incubator. The incubator was provided by the funds from paper salvage.

A resolution regarding the death of the late C. A. Goodrich was written into the minutes of the meeting. Mr. Goodrich, former manager of Case Bros., was a member of the Paper Salvage committee from its inception.


