Coal Strike Peace Not Seen Possible For 5 More Days

Washington, May 2.—(AP)—John Lewis today seemed to have virtually ruled out any possibility of a coal strike settlement for at least five more days as dwindling fuel supplies cut most Illinois factories and business establishments to 20 or 24 hours of electricity.

No Agreement Before Tuesday Lewis' action in summoning a 250-man Policy committee of the United Mine Workers to Washington Tuesday was construed by close observers of previous strike strategy to indicate he did not expect any agreement with the soft coal operators by the end of the week.

The committee would have to deny any action proposed, but also could have been summoned to hear a report on progress toward a settlement.

Shortage More Acute As the coal shortage became more acute, Acting Health Commissioner Israel Weinstein in New York City today said it was "very grave."

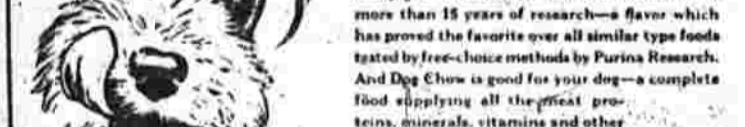
