Dog's Life Not Too Bad In Proposed New Pound

When the Board of Selectmen heard the specifications set up by the State Commissioner of Domestic Animals for a new dog pound here they were of the opinion that the building suggested would make a fairly good temporary home for a returned war veteran. The cost and the materials called for would provide fairly good living quarters, they agreed.

The Selectmen are giving consideration to the erection of a new pound for lost, strayed or abandoned dogs, because residents on Middle Turnpike, east, in the vicinity of the present pound, which is on the almshouse property, are complaining about the disturbance the dogs create during the night.

Half of the return on dog licenses made until June 1 go to the state, the other half to the town. Funds for the erection of a new pound can be obtained by withholding the state's share of the dog license money up to the cost of the building. However, because state funds would be used, the State Commissioner of Domestic Animals is empowered to set up the specifications for the pound.

Last night a letter from Domestic Animals Inspector G. B. Gunning containing suggested specifications for the pound was read to the Selectmen. A brick or cinder block structure with concrete floor, furnished with hot and cold running water, electric lights, small stove, sink, food cabinet, and an outside exercise yard, is called for in the specifications. The exercise yard might not appeal to a G.I. veteran, it was commented.

The cost of the structure was estimated by Selectman Chamberlain, himself a contractor, at no less than \$2,500.

The letter follows: Mr. George H. Waldell, Treasurer "Town of Manchester, Connecticut. "Dear Sir: "I am listing some of the re-

quirements which should be incorporated in the proposed new dog pound. Local conditions or ability to obtain material may cause alterations of substituting. As this building is to be a permanent one, it should be large enough to care for the needs of Manchester for years to come.

"I would suggest a building about 14x18 feet constructed of brick or cinder block with cement floor and having a center drain. Two or more barred windows for light and ventilation, also a ventilated roof is desirable. Flushing water with hose for flushing pens and floor and electricity for lights, also extra plug for heating dog food when necessary. An outside wire run, partly covered, for exercise yard and to hold dogs while cleaning the inside. Gas box outside and near enough to read so auto exhaust may be used for disposal of unwanted march.

"Equipment inside should consist of at least six large cages, six smaller cages and one large cage for isolating suspected diseased dogs or holding dogs for observation. Splice for small stove which may be needed in severe weather. This device for mixing food and washing feeding pans, etc. Cabinet for holding food equipment, disinfectants, etc. The cages should be constructed with cement floors with center drain so they could be flushed out after being used. "The cages should have solid wall between them and heavy wire top and front. It is desirable to have cages set up 20 or 24 inches from the floor to make it easier to get dogs into and out of them. "I hope this will assist you in drawing up plans for the pound. If I can be of any further assistance in this matter, please call on me. I would like to see the layout when ready. Very truly yours, G. B. Gunning, Domestic Animals Inspector."

Berlin, May 8.—(AP)—One year ago this week the finest Army ever fought under the American flag ceased battle operations. It was the United States First Army.

Because neither of the two men who commanded it had a fair for to claim the glory of liberating personal publicity, it never had the acclaim won by Gen. George Patton's famous Third Army. It was the First Army that captured the first German city, Aachen.
