### The Maritime Strike

The approaching strike of the CIO maritime unions has several international ramifications. In the first place, the operators claim, and past experience sustains them, that the future of the American merchant marine is at stake. Without trying to do more than the justice of the new wage and hour demands now being made, the unions are seeking a 40-hour week and a 25-cent an hour increase of 22 to 35 cents an hour—it has been America's past experience that the higher wages paid our maritime workers have made unsubsidized competition with the shipping of other nations impossible for us. Now it is being asked that the wages of our men go still higher. And the question, unfortunately, is not purely one of whether or not those American maritime workers deserve the basis of other American wages in other industries, more money for the work they do. There is also involved in the question, what we have done the right thing in this bill, we are still unconsciously deluging and sabotaging our own shipping industry.
