



(Now, with the seat removed from the chair, you can easily handle it). Get your material and hold it over the chair seat, cutting it just enough larger so that you have a good tacking surface; or use the old seat cover as a pattern. Smooth out the padding, adding some if necessary. Now tack the cover over the padding. No. 2 or No. 2½ tacks are suitable for leatherette or light material; but you might need No. 3 for a heavier, woven fabric. Fold under, and at the corners crease it wherthe corners crease it wherever it is necessary to obtain a rounded edge. Then tack it in place. This done, you can replace the chair seat in the chair and fasten again with the screws. The back of the chair, if it is the leatherette or cloth covered type, can be re-covered in the same manner. A really beautiful effect can be obtained by using a matching fabric on your chairs and curtains in your kitchen or dinette. It may wear out rather fast, but it can be easily replaced and it does look so different and livable.




