# Battle Catastrophe; Victors

## Bi-Partisan Group Brings Quiet to Bullet Ridden Athens, Tenn., As Election to County Offices Conceded by Leader of Opposition; Mobilization on State Guardsmen Cancelled

Athens, Tenn., Aug. 2—(AP)—A bi-partisan group of former GIs, their election to McMinn county offices conceded by a leader of the opposition, brought quiet to bullet ridden Athens today after a bloody six-hour gun battle around a now battered jail.

### 18 Injured, Six Seriously

At least 18 persons were injured, six seriously, in the election day strife which began yesterday afternoon and continued until 3 a. m. when a score or more deputized officers surrendered their hold on the two-story brick prison building.

Before complete order could be restored, several automobiles were overturned or stripped, and near riots swept over this town of 7,000, suddenly bereft of formal law enforcement from county agencies.

A mobilization of State Guardsmen was cancelled and a spokesman for the GI forces said they would maintain order until a mass meeting Monday when it was hoped some provision for filling county offices would be made.

### Orders Investigation

In Washington, Attorney General Tom Clark ordered an investigation today of the gun battle. The Civil Rights section of the Justice department was directed to determine whether Federal laws were violated.

The battle of the Jail, pocked and battered from bullets and home made bombs tossed by former GI sympathizers, was a direct outgrowth of the bitter political campaign waged by the veterans to overturn the Democratic organization of State Senator Paul Cantrell, in power for a decade.

Frank Cantrell, mayor of nearby Etowah, telephoned an Athens newspaper this morning that "on

### Bandits Get \$26,932 Payroll

Boston, Aug. 2. — (AP) — Three men, two of them masked and armed with pistols, today robbed the Gold Seal Shoe Corporation of a \$26,932 payroll after disarming a guard and cowing 30 women employees in the company's office in Boston's South End. Arnold Watkins, a guard for the Wolf Security Service, said two of the men, wearing paper bags over their heads with holes for their eyes, ordered him to stand against a wall. They removed his gun and club and waved back women employees with the order "Don't anybody move and you won't get hurt."

### Tel Aviv Curfew Lifted

Tel Aviv, Palestine, Aug. 2—(AP)—The four-day curfew on most of this all-Jewish city of 200,000 was lifted at 3 p.m. today and the people swarmed from their homes where they had been held virtual prisoners while British troops carried out the most intensive search for arms and terrorists in the history of the Holy Land. One section of the city along the northern beach, where the final searching sweep was carried out, remained under curfew until 5 p.m.

### Woman Killed By Truck

Hartford, Aug. 2—m—Mrs. Anna Lungholm of 11 Plymouth road, West Hartford, was fatally injured this noon when she was struck by a truck opposite 650 Main street. Mrs. Lungholm died shortly after admission to Hartford hospital. Policeman George Goodman said the driver was William D. Stanley of 228 High street. The truck was owned by the A. C. Loveland Co., dealers in paper.

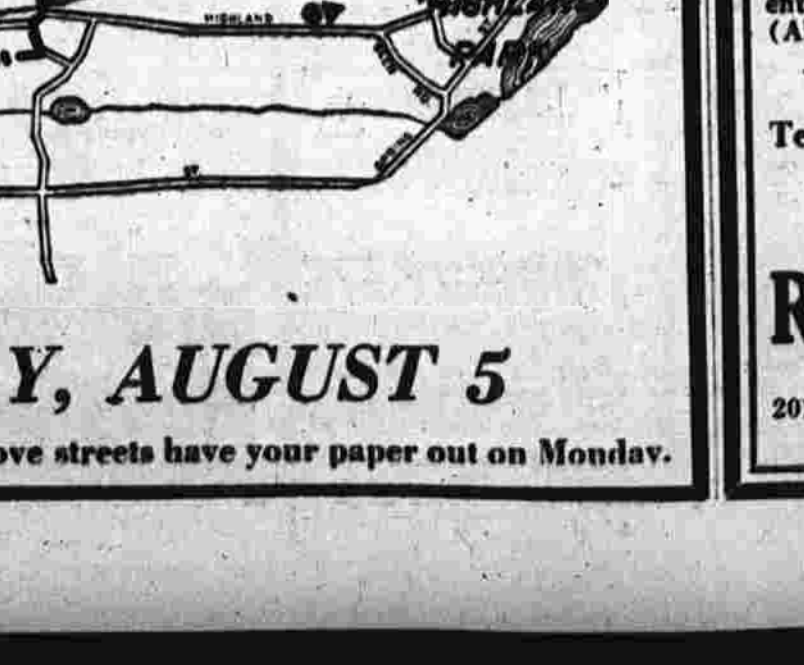
