Truman and Wage Stabilization Board Approve Foreman Pact

Washington, Aug. 8.—The labor union movement has won its first round in its fight to stabilize wages and prices. President Truman and the Wage Stabilization Board approved a contract covering 135 supervisory positions at four jobs and 140 jobs in the steel industry.

Under terms of the agreement, the union will receive a 10 percent wage increase over the next 12 months. The contract also provides for a 10 percent increase in the cost of living index.
