Washington, Aug. 22—47)—Senator Eibert Thomas (D-Utah) proposed today that President Truman order into immediate effect a partial merger of Army and Navy functions.

Thomas, who is chairman of the Senate Military committee, told a reporter he is drafting a letter to that effect which Mr. Truman will find on his desk when he returns from his vacation at sea.

Specifically, the senator said he will appeal for establishment of a council of national defense such as is called for in pending merger legislation. That legislation failed to reach a vote in either house before Congress quit three weeks ago.
