The court agreed with Attorney General Robert W. Kenny that the knights of the hood and robe—
"10-cent terrorists," Keffny called them—did not qualify.

The attorney general's investigators had turned up nearly half a ton of anti-Semitic, anti-Catholic, anti-Negro literature, plus paraphernalis which included a portable electric flery cross. Does Not Outlaw Klan The court decree did not outlaw the Klan in California. Kenny's suit to revoke its charter was cal lated to cripple organizing mo Klan rolled up a state membership of 100,000 within a few months, collected a tidy treasury with \$10 initiation fees and was soon putting heavy pressure on courts and presecutors. It died down after the national organization was dis-

."We wanted to move as fast as possible to smash the outfit's ma-chinery for growth," said Kenny. "Taking the profit out is the most effective way to do that. And stripping it of respectability robbed it of a strong talking point in recruiting new members. Five former Klan officials wh appeared at the trial testified that the reason they gave up the activity in recent years was the drying up of their income as paid organizers. Theodore S. Moodie, a former grand dragon, testified he was getting \$7,500 a year in 1933.

Ray J. Schneider, a former Kleagle, testified that after the organization disbanded in 1944 some members continued to operate under guise of card clubs or fraternal groups. Just how extensive the Klan is in California today is impossible to say. The FBI appeared at the trial testified that day is impossible to say. 





Dr. Alphons Dopfer, top-rank Munich veterinarian and known throughout Germany for his skill with dogs, said he would try. The ailing dog got well. But the fuehrer never paid the bill.

Dopfer told the story at his office, now reduced to a tiny apartment in a bomb-wrecked building only 150 yards from the wreck of Hitler's Brown House, scene of his 1923 putsch.

Now 53, Dopfer, a tall, strong man, with piercing eyes and clipped moustache, would just as soon forget the 6,000 marks he says Hitler owed him. In the first place, he says, it was forced labor, and his experience at the dictator's chalet and later at Army headquarters on the Russian front dismayed his dog lover's soul.
