

Summarizing its contention that such education was particularly important for members of specific professions, the committee said:

"Social workers need psychiatric instruction. One of the principles underlying all educational measures is the fact that society should bear some of the responsibility of adjusting patients in their home and communities.

May Do Incalculable Damage

"The minister, priest or rabbi should know more mental hygiene than he does. He may, and frequently does, see the psychotic before anyone else. But if he is not sensitized to the problems of phy-

"The lawyer needs psychiatric education. The lawyer should have sufficient understanding of the psychoses to protect himself against the psychotic who is constantly importuning him to redress imaginary wrongs.

"The policeman brings many patients to the mental hospitals. "The psychotics of 10, 15 and 20 years from now are in our schools today. The informed and orientated achoolteacher can do orientated schoolteacher can much along preventive lines." Secondary Advantage Cited

The committee cited as a sec-ondary advantage to such a pro-gram the benefit it said the em-ployes of mental hospitals would "They have been waging a lone-ly fight for many years," the re-port said. "By seeing groups of 80 or more policemen, social workers, etc., studying in the hos-pitals once a month, they will realize that they are not alone."
