Says Britain Has No Plan for Palestine; India Situation Hit

London, Oct. 5.—(AP)—Winston Churchill said today that Britain's Labor government was "hesitating without any plan or policy" for Palestine and was "holding onto a mandate in which they have no vital interest."

Churchill also charged that the Attlee government had mishandled the Indian problem so badly that "no one can measure the blood and bloodshed which will overtake these enormous masses of helpless millions under what new power their future and destiny will be."

What No Bases in Europe?

We don't think the theory that the movement of the United States Navy about the Mediterranean was a "good will" tour...

Because the good will fantasy was so obvious, it is at least honest news to have Secretary of State Forrestal come right out and admit that our ships have been on the move and will continue in the Mediterranean...

Now that the cat is officially off the bag, perhaps American diplomacy will be conducted to defend it, and to explain to the American people, whose ships these ships are supporting...

When meat does come out, it will, by present prospects, come out in legitimate channels. Whatever meat there is, it is being upped, and it is not being upped for to any exclusive black market trade.
