Five Aboard Bomber Lose Lives in Crash; 26 on Airliner Saved

Two Accidents in Pea Soup Fog Eight Miles Apart in Virginia During Night; Planes, Attempting to Land Under 300-Foot Ceiling, Strike Within Period of 40 Minutes

Alexandria, Va., Oct. 12.-(P)-Two plane crashes in a pea soup fog eight miles apart last midnight killed all five aboard an Army bomber but spared 26 persons who crawled from the blazing wreckage of a big Eastern Airlines DC-4. The planes, attempting to land under a 300-foot ceiling, struck within 40 minutes of each other in the scrub pine countryside near here, a few miles south of Washington.

Apparently Hit Lumber Pile Eye-witnesses said the DC-4, en route from Miami to New York route from Miami to New York via Atlanta, apparently hit a farmer's lumber pile as the pilot groped blindly through the dense fog for a landing. The ship carcened against a well house, ripped into a 2,300-volt high tension power line crashed in a valley and burst into flames.

Debris was strewn over half a

Debris was strewn over half a mile of the wooded muddy terrain about five miles south of here.

"It was incredible that anybody got out alive," said one of the first persons to reach the scene.

"The plane's wings were ripped off and the cabin fuselage was burning furiously halfway down the hill. Part of a wing lay 1,000 feet away on the hillop. One of the plane's four motors was 500 feet off to the side. Lattle pieces of steel were scattered all over the field."

Czech Compromise Proposal / to Transfer 200,000 Maygars to Hungary Through Bilateral Agreement To Be Backed First; America Will Insist Shift Be Voluntary

Paris, Oct. 12.—(P)—Lieut. Gen. Walter B. Smith told the Peace conference today that the United States was ready to back the transfer of some Magyar-populated areas of Czechoslovakia to defeated Hungary if necessary. Smith,

Hungary if necessary. Smith, the U. S. ambassador to Russia, said the United States would support Czechosjavakia's compromise proposal to transfer 200,000 Magyars from Czech territory to Hungary through a bilateral agreement.

"Every effort should be made," General Smith declared, "through minor territorial changes if necessary, to reduce to the minimum the number of people forced to leave their ancestral homes" under such an agreement."

String Of Slav Speech Smith's statement was sand smith's statement was annowiched between a string of Siav speeches which opened plenary season debate on the peace pact for Hungary—the fourth of five treaties to be considered. Slav delegates urged Hungary to join more solidly with the Slav-Danubian group of states.


