New York, Nov. 2.—(AP)—Vyacheslav M. Molotov, Soviet Russian foreign minister, says the opinion expressed by some Americans that his address to the United Nations Assembly disagrees with Prime Minister Stalin's statement on Russian policy Monday does not correspond to the facts.

Declines to Answer Questions Furthered, Molotov declined to answer six detailed questions submitted to him by the Associated Press. Molotov said last night that "it is not difficult to see this after careful study of the text in question."

Baldwin Cites Welfare Acts

Proves Republican Administration Friend of Individual Citizen

Hartford, Nov. 2.—(P)—The Republican party, Governor Baldwin says, "believes in the welfare of the individual citizen, and has enacted five ways in which he has the Republican administration in Connecticut proved this assertion.
