Federal judge, T. Alan Goldsborough, an dtold him: 1. Lewis had no right to tear up his contract.

The judge decided on two things: First, a restraining order, and then, maybe, an injunction.

To keep the miners working until he could dig into the case, the judge told Lewis:

1. For the 10 days ending Nov.
27 you are under a restraining order not to tear up your contract.

2. On Nov. 27 you and the government can come into court and argue whether an injunction should be issued to keep you from tearing up your contract.

(The judge hadn't decided about issuing an injunction against Lewis. He wasn't going to decide that until he had heard both sides.)

But Lewis didn't wait for a hearing on the injunction. He just ignored the temporary restraining order. He let his contract stay torn. His miners walked out.
Why did Lewis ignore the restraining order?
His lawyers point to the Norris-LaGuardia act and say that, under the act, the judge had no right to

They were saying here that, since they thought the judge had no right to issue any order at all, there was no reason for Lewis to there was no reason for Lewis to But the government lawyers

argue:
1. In this case it was the government, not a private employer, which had a contract with a union. The Norris-LaGuardia act covers only union contracts with private employers.

2. Therefore, the judge had a right to issue the order since the Norris-LaGuardia act nowhere forbids court interference in a labor

ment.

The judge tells Lewis that anyone—even though he thinks the courts have no right to issue a restraining order—must obey it because there'd be "anarchy" if everyone could disobey court orders. Now the judge will have to rule

on whether he had a right, under the Norris-LaGuardia act, to issue, a restraining order against Lewis. But even if the judge decides he had no right to issue the order, he still will have to decide whether Lewis, once the order was issued, should have obeyed it anyway.

If the judge decides that he, the judge, was wrong in issuing the order but that Lewis was wrong in disobeying it, he can fine or jail Lewis






