Azerbaijan Council Agrees to Iranian Units in Province

Message Wired Premier by Communist Government-General; Troops Advance Beyond Mountain Pass to Battle in Mianch District

Tehran, Dec. 11.—(AP)—The Tabriz radio announced today that Dr. Sallamollari Javid, the Communist government-general of Azerbaijan province, had wired Premier Ahmad Qavam that the Provisional Council agreed to the assignment of government security forces in Azerbaijan.

Four columns of government troops were dispatched only yesterday across the frontier of the semi-autonomous state which had rejected Qavam's orders for government supervision of this region.

Iranian Army headquarters announced this afternoon that a Zenzan-based column had driven past Azerbaijan fortifications in the Ghafoorkoh mountain pass and were battling positions in the "Mianch district," centered about a rail and highway town five miles north of the passes.

House Appropriations committee questioned the ability of the Republicans to slash taxes and make sizeable payments on the debt. Cannon wants Congress to stipulate by law that there can be no tax cuts until \$5,000,000,000 is paid each year on the government's obligations.

Expect Stand Against Cuts. Most members of Congress expect President Truman in his January message to the Republican Congress to take a firm position against tax slashes until a substantial cut is made in the debt. Cannon, although retaining his

dropped back to pre-war levels with the belt anywhere near what it is now. They point out that even in the boom year of 1929 tax collections were only \$4,000,000,000—about a billion less than now must be paid each year in interest on the debt. In 1932 government revenues dropped to \$2,000,000,000.

On the other hand, those who want taxes cut contend that government levies already have reached the point of diminishing returns. They cite a 1923 statement by Andrew Mellon, then secretary of the treasury, that the result of high taxes is this: "To stop business transactions that would normally go through and to discourage men of wealth from taking the risks which are incidental to the development of new business."

greater government revenues reaped is a fact proved by experience of the Republicans through the 1920s when tax rates were reduced four times and government revenues were so increased by encouraged business and commerce that the national debt was reduced 36.5 per cent—at the rate of practically a billion dollars per year for 10 years.

Lawmakers are dividing sharply into two camps. One demands that, by all means, cut down the debt by every dollar possible during the flush post-war era. Otherwise, this group says, a recession at some later day may play havoc.

The House Republican steering committee, in its Nov. 14 election victory meeting, called for "a 20 per cent reduction across the board in personal income taxes." The committee "thumbed" back into history and said it found:

"That tax rates can be cut and interest payments alone on the debt amount to \$5,000,000,000 a year—a sum greater than the government's average annual take from all revenues in pre-war years. That poses a lot of questions."



Boyle's COLUMN

By Hal Boyle

New York, Dec. 11.—(AP)—Vice Admiral Daniel E. Barbey thinks the United States might "suffer a few hours" in the event of a future surprise attack against it with mass destruction weapons.

"But they couldn't launch it out," said the commander of the Fourth fleet and veteran of 43 landings in the Pacific, "and within a matter of hours our reprisal attacks would be underway on a large scale."

Barbey believes that America has at least a ten-year edge over other countries in the production of weapons of mass destruction. "They are a practical monopoly. But we must keep planning ahead."

He says this military advantage is the strongest because of the United States.

If another war does come, however, Barbey said, "it would not be a duel between gentlemen, but a war for the survival of the masses of civilization."

He said he could see no reason for emphasizing possible attacks over the north pole. He thought it more likely that a foreign enemy would "send out a dozen or so submarines and attack our eastern coastal cities from scattered positions hundreds of miles out in the Atlantic."

Rockets carrying atomic warheads could be used even while the submarines were submerged, he added.

Retaliation Would Be Swift

"But our retaliation would be swift, unavoidable by the enemy, and more damaging—if we keep our strength," said Barbey.

The admiral took issue with those who believe that in the event of a war with Soviet Russia, the Russians would move huge infantry masses into western Europe and seize such centers as Rome, Antwerp and Paris in the hope that we would not attempt to use our friendly capitals and so would again require a gigantic expeditionary force and a long drive to drive out the invaders.

Barbey, who feels that United Nations progress makes such a war highly hypothetical, said that even if such a situation came to pass no big land armies by America would be needed.

Could Isolate Russian Armies

"Nor would we find it necessary to bomb Paris, Antwerp or Rome," he continued. "By atom-bombing Leningrad, Moscow, Kiev, Odessa, and other main communications centers we could isolate the Russian Armies in western Europe from their supplies — and keep them isolated."

"What would happen then?"

"If the subjected peoples remain true to their political beliefs, they would soon rise and destroy these masses of Russian foot troops, cut off from ammunition, fuel and ideological support from their own country."

"The Russians couldn't adapt local production facilities in time to save themselves. No modern Army can live off the land in the manner of Genghis Khan. It will disintegrate instead into a bow and arrow Army, which the civilians could cope with."

Germany supported her armies with slave labor. But the laborers worked in Germany in German industries.

Would Simply Move Capitals

"If western Europe is inherently Communist and the occupied countries joined the invaders instead of resisting them, then the Russians would succeed. They would in effect simply move their capitals to Rome or Paris."

"In that case, if Europe really wanted Communism, there would be no point in further fighting. We couldn't impose our system on them."

Asked whether, if the nations secretly construct weapons of mass destruction despite the vigilance of investigative commissions, Barbey replied:

"In my opinion, no. We would keep in time to take counter-measures."

Non-Stop Planes Hop From Boston

Boston, Dec. 11.—(AP)—Two TransWorld Airlines Constellation took off early today on the first non-stop commercial flight from Boston's Logan International airport to Shannon, Eire.

Commercial flights out of Boston have stopped at Gander, N.F.L.D., in the past.

TransWorld identified the planes as the Star of Cairo and the Star of Hollywood. The former got away at 12:36 a. m. (e.s.t.) and the latter at 3:24 a. m. (e.s.t.) They are expected to complete the trip in 8 1/2 hours.

The Star of Cairo carried 34 passengers, a crew of seven and three thousand pounds of air mail. The other craft had 22 passengers and crew or seven, including Gen. Karol Swierczewski, vice-minister of national defense in Poland, who has just completed a tour of the United States, Canada and Mexico.
